

THE LOWDOWN GORDON ELLIOTT

Magical season on cards for hungry trainer with wealth of ammunition

RIDAY, March 18, 2016,
Cheltenham and Don
Cossack is leading the Gold
Cup field down to the final
fence. Bryan Cooper counts the
strides in his head, something he
has done a million times before, but
these are the strides he's been
preparing for throughout his whole
career. One, two, three and Don
Cossack responds to negotiate the
jump and scoot up the Cheltenham
hill with over four lengths in hand
from his nearest rival.

Don Cossack, a Gold Cup winner. Time now for his trainer Gordon Elliott to exhale. In truth, he had been holding his breath for long enough, as the young trainer waxed lyrically about the son of little known sire Sholokhov when he was only learning his trade in bumpers. But that is a different story for a different day. Now, the Gigginstown House Stud-owned gelding had delivered, and in turn, provided 38-year-old Elliott with the greatest moment of his career.

"I actually sat back and watched the race for the first time in a while the other day," Elliott says. "It would put you in good form looking at it. The Gold Cup is the biggest race in the world for me and of course it was the best day in my career."

Whether Don Cossack will be able to defend his Gold Cup crown next March remains to be seen, but Elliott is cautiously optimistic he can nurse the nine-year-old back to full fitness following the tendon injury that ruled him out of the Punchestown Festival in April.

"Every day could be their last day after a leg injury, but he's back doing road work and his latest scans were all good so he'll be back here with us at Cullentra House in early October all being well.

"If we get a clean run with him, we'll probably get one race into him before he goes back to defend the Gold Cup. The Kinloch Brae Chase at Thurles served him well last season and that could be the place to go with him again this season as it will be late enough before we'd have him ready and options are pretty slim at that stage."

No More Heroes had looked a hugely exciting prospect for Elliott, but sadly his career was cut short when he was fatally injured in the RSA Chase at Cheltenham.

"That was a massive blow. We thought he was going to be our next Gold Cup horse. He'd probably done more as a novice than Don Cossack had achieved at a similar stage and we were all very excited about him. But that's the game we're in and you have to give yourself a shake and keep going."

Some 30 minutes after that blow, Elliott was provided with the best possible tonic when **Diamond King** weaved his way through a wall of horses to win the Coral Cup, and he is set to go novice chasing this season.

"We were lucky he delivered at Cheltenham. Talk about the ups and downs of the game. He'll be out early in the season and is probably going to be aimed at the Drinmore Novices' Chase at Fairyhouse. I'd say he doesn't really want winter heavy ground so we'll probably have him ready for some of those novice chases run earlier in the season, give him a break during the hardest part of the winter, and then get him ready for Cheltenham. The JLT Novices' Chase could suit him."

Prince could be 'very good'

If there is going to be a horse to step forward and become the top-notch staying novice chaser Elliott so desperately craves, **Prince Of Scars** may be the one to deliver.

Having progressed from handicap hurdle company to winning a Grade 1 staying hurdle at Leopardstown last Christmas, Elliott has always viewed him as a chaser and counts last season's exploits as a pleasant surprise.

"He could be a very good horse over fences this year for us. He's come back in looking a lot stronger this season and he was always going to be a chaser.

"I know he's won a Grade 1 over hurdles but chasing is his game. He looks a million dollars and he's definitely one I'm looking forward In the same Gigginstown House Stud colours, Elliott has the likes of Tombstone, Tycoon Prince and Ball D'Arc to look forward to, but admits splitting up his novice chasers will be a new and exciting challenge this "I've never had as many good novices over fences so it's a great problem to have," he says. "Tombstone ran very well to finish fourth in the Supreme at Cheltenham but has had a few problems since that. He's another who is going to go chasing, but I think his trip is going to be 2m4f as opposed to 2m. He's delicate but he has a big engine. He isn't the easiest to train Prince Of Scars: expected to shine over fences this season

but if we can keep him right, I'd be looking forward to seeing what he could do around the good tracks.

"Tycoon Prince has had a wind operation. We aren't entirely sure if he'll go chasing or stay hurdling yet. He's extremely well handicapped over hurdles. He has a very big engine and could be a horse who is just growing into himself now. With the wind operation he could be all right this year. He's a massive horse but doesn't lack for pace – he's very fast.

"Ball D'Arc is another to look out for. He's not slow and we'll be going 2m novice chasing with him. He has a big engine, too."

The real deal

Asked about some of the horses who won't be carrying the maroon and white jersey of Gigginstown, Elliott is quick to mention the JP McManusowned **Sutton Place**, a horse who steadily improved from winning a bumper at Fairyhouse last January before finishing his



season with a battling Grade 2 success over hurdles at that same track over Easter.

"He looks the real deal. He'll be ready to start off late October and he could be anything. We'll start him off small and see how he progresses but he seems to have the right attitude and we'll let him tell us whether he wants 2m or 2m4f. He's definitely a very nice horse."

It is unlikely Elliott would have expected to have **Free Expression** among his novice chasers for this season, but the son of Germany failed to get his head in front in three starts over fences last year and his trainer hopes he can find the key to him this time.

"He's a very good horse but at the same time he's been a little bit frustrating. He'll start off in a beginners' chase and we'll take it from there. He definitely has the ability and hopefully we can find the key to him."

'I can't wait for Missy Tata'

Before conversation switches to novice hurdlers, **Missy Tata's** name is mentioned as a possible dark horse as a chaser.

"I can't wait to see her over fences. We'll start her off against her own sex before taking full advantage of her age and sex allowance against the geldings. She'll win plenty of races, that's for sure."

Fagan is another who will be campaigned modestly to start off, with Elliott keen to take baby steps with last season's Albert Bartlett Novices' Hurdle runner-up before aiming at something like the four-miler at Cheltenham.

Best staying novice hurdler

Death Duty was a highly promising bumper horse for the stable last season winning two of his three starts, and his sole defeat at Fairyhouse came at the hands of subsequent Grade 1 Punchestown Champion Bumper scorer Blow By Blow.

Elliott says: "He could be very good and I'd say he's our best staying novice hurdler. We'll be campaigning him over 2m4f to 3m and he's one I've always liked a lot. He's a real nice horse and we'll start him around a good big galloping track."

The former jump jockey-turned-trainer has assembled the most powerful bunch of novice chasers yet, some cracking novice hurdlers and plenty of old familiars who will be taking high rank in some of the most prestigious handicap chases either side of the Irish Sea throughout the winter.

Irish National firepower

Mala Beach was unlucky not to get his head in front last season. The Chris Jones-owned eight-year-old was narrowly beaten in the Thyestes Chase at Gowran Park before falling at the second-last fence when travelling like the winner in front under Davy Russell in the Bobbyjo Chase at Fairyhouse.

"He was unlucky he didn't win a big one last year so, touch wood, we can make up for it this time. Something like the Irish National could be right up his street and I wouldn't rule out reverting to hurdles."

Jones could have another decent staying handicap chaser on his hands in the shape of **Noble Endeavor**, who would have gone very close to winning the four-miler at Cheltenham but for coming down two fences from the finish.

"His jumping let him down in the second half of the season. He was running a big race in the four-miler before he fell and I'd say he wasn't going to be too far away," Elliott says. "He'll be competing in staying handicap chases, and again, he could be bound for the Irish National."

While Elliott has yet to win the Fairyhouse showpiece, there was a notable first success in the Galway Plate this summer when **Lord Scoundrel** got a deserved day in the sun having bumped into some top novice chasers last season.

"He came out of Galway great. We're aiming him at Gowran Park for the PWC Champion Chase on October 1. After that we'll be looking to Down Royal for the second-season novices' chase and then we'll take it from there."

The Game Changer will be kept to the minimum trip for the majority of the season and will be seen at his best when encountering better ground.

Asked for three dark horses, Elliott is keen to put forward the relatively lightly raced four-time winner **Ned Stark**, whom he purchased out of Alan King's stable.

"He could be a horse for a nice handicap – maybe something like a Paddy Power Chase at Leopardstown over Christmas.

Last Minute Man can win plenty of races

"Of the younger brigade, **Last Minute Man** is a lovely horse by
Yeats who we think will win plenty
of races for Paul and Clare
Rooney.

"We also have a horse here for Gigginstown called **Burren Life** and he could be worth following. He fell at the last in a point-to-point and he should win his bumper."

With two Wexford sand gallops and a woodchip gallop with an incline finish, two schooling grounds and now a new swimming pool installed, Elliott approaches the season with his best team of horses yet, together with even better facilities, but can he challenge Willie Mullins for the trainers' title in Ireland this year?

Dreams of becoming champion trainer

"I'm not stupid and I've been second behind Willie for the past five years now," he says.

"That's the way it's going to be for a while, but we'll keep nibbling away at him every year and maybe one day we'll get there.

"If I didn't dream of one day becoming champion then I shouldn't be training racehorses, because you need to be hungry in this game."

THE LOWDOWN NICKY HENDERSON

Sprinter spearheads Seven Barrows team packed with quality

ICKY HENDERSON, who performed a minor miracle to return Sprinter Sacre to the top of the 2m chasing tree last season, hopes the popular ten-year-old will be able to maintain that form this term, but admits a formidable rival lies in wait in the shape of imposing Racing Post Arkle winner Douvan.

Henderson, who was champion trainer in 2013, earned plenty of plaudits for his handling of Caroline Mould's brilliant chaser, who brought the house down at Cheltenham in March when he regained the Champion Chase crown he won in 2013 before his career was threatened by heart problems.

The master of Seven Barrows, who has a crack team assembled for the coming months, says: "Cheltenham was everything and what happened that day was extraordinary. It was one of the most emotional days I can remember."

Sprinter Sacre's first main target is likely to be the Betfair Tingle Creek at Sandown in December, when he could clash with Douvan, who is odds-on in places for the Betway-backed Champion Chase.

"He's come back looking brilliant. He's as big as I've ever seen him – he weighs 630kg.

He's massive but looks fantastic. He's doing the same as everything else at the moment – they're all doing their build-up work – and if everything is 100 per cent with him off we go again.

"He was giving us very good vibes this time last year and into the Shloer Chase, but when I was looking for a reason not to run him at Sandown on the final day of the season he was so good and he told us that.

"I actually think he was a better horse at Sandown when he won the Celebration Chase than he was at Cheltenham and as long as he's in that mode we've got to keep going, but there's one little thing and it's called Douvan."

Henderson continues: "I'd imagine the Tingle Creek would be Sprinter's objective for the first part of the season and it's entirely possible he could run again in the Shloer at Cheltenham, but that's only three weeks before Sandown and this time he'd have the penalty he didn't have to carry last year.

"The race that matters is in March, and I suspect we all felt Kempton wasn't the ideal place for him last season and therefore the Desert Orchid Chase may not feature this year."

Sprinter Sacre is among the old guard at the stable and, while former favourite Bobs Worth has been retired, Henderson is optimistic **Simonsig** can continue to WINNERS IN LAST FIVE SFASONS 81, 129, 124, 125, 167

DID YOU KNOW?

Nicky Henderson is a three-time champion trainer, but he had to wait a long time for his third title. He initially won it in 1986, taking over the mantle from his old boss Fred Winter, and again in 1987. It was 2013 before he did it again, although his biggest number of winners in a season was recorded the previous year when he had 167 victories.

perform with credit. He has had an interrupted career but thrilled Henderson with his third in Punchestown's Champion Chase in May before finishing down the field over hurdles on unsuitably soft ground in the Prix la Barka.

"He's purposely not had a very long break and we hope to be ready for an autumn campaign back over fences," says the trainer.

"There's no doubt he's retained a lot of his old ability and he showed us at home that he was very nearly as good as ever.

"Like Caroline with Sprinter, his owner Ronnie Bartlett has been amazing because it's taken a long time and he adores the horse."

Aintree again for Triolo

If there is one race Nicky Henderson would dearly love to add to his bulging CV it is the Grand National, and the trainer will be praying for a dry spring when **Triolo D'Alene** bids to make it third-time lucky in the sport's most famous jumps race.

The 2013 Topham winner's two efforts in the Aintree marathon – pulled up in 2014 and 14th in April – were affected by rain.

"We've encountered exceptionally soft ground, which is something he simply cannot cope with," says Henderson, whose best National finishes came with Zongalero and The Tsarevich, who were second in 1979 and 1987.

Aintree is also on the agenda for **Hadrian's Approach** and **Cocktails At Dawn**, who both prefer a sound surface, while **Vyta Du Roc** is another possible.

Henderson has won five Topham Chases over the National fences and says: "I seem to say the same every year in we can go round once, but can't seem to do it twice. We need to win the National.

"We have a good team of staying handicap chasers and some of those could be in the mix for Hennessys and all other Grand Nationals."

Other senior chasers expected to flourish over shorter trips are **Josses Hill**, **Vaniteux**, **L'Ami Serge** and **Full Shift**, who were involved at Cheltenham in March.

while Henderson would love to see **Close Touch** come back to what he's capable of.

Supreme ace heading over fences

Altior, whose five-race winning streak over hurdles last season culminated in a brilliant victory in the Supreme Novices' Hurdle, will spearhead Nicky Henderson's team of novice chasers this term.

"We'd always hoped he was a bit special and I'm glad to say hopes were realised last season," says Henderson, whose exciting gelding is a general 4-1 chance for the Racing Post Arkle.

"We've spent the summer deliberating whether he should stay over hurdles with a view to having a look at the Champion, or switch to fences and aim at the Arkle. After a lot of thought, discussion and at times a lot of indecision, we decided to take the novice chase route.

"He's now a six-year-old, rising seven, and if we don't go chasing now I suspect we might never. It was also very obvious he'd grown considerably through the summer and, although he was always a big horse, he now looks like a chaser. As much as it would be tempting to see if he was good enough for a Champion Hurdle, which I think he is, we've plumped for fences.

"We schooled him once in the spring to help us make this decision and he was absolutely excellent."

Buveur could also go chasing

Henderson's novice chase crew will be further strengthened if **Buveur D'Air** – third to Altior in the Supreme and a Grade 1 winner at Aintree – also makes the move to fences.

That decision has not yet been made but the five-year-old will be schooled over fences at home, possibly when new owner JP McManus's retained rider Barry Geraghty returns from injury.

"He has the size and scope to jump fences but could still be a very high-class hurdler," says Henderson.

"He's come back in looking bigger and



stronger and has an enormous future whichever road we choose to take. Apart from Altior and possibly Buveur D'Air, we have a very big and talented squad of highclass hurdlers who are now due to switch to chasing.

Novice chase firepower

"Days Of Heaven has already won a novice chase and is heading for the American Grand National, but the likes of **Top Notch**, who isn't overly big, has already schooled very well, as have Graded hurdlers Different Gravey, O O Seven and Brain Power. Whisper, twice a winner of the Grade 1 Liverpool Stayers' Hurdle, could also join the party.

"Other talented performers Laurium, Beware The Bear, Gold Present, Might Bite and Kilcrea Vale are also set to make the transition, whereas Theinval and Hammersly Lake have already won their first novice chase."

Interestingly, four-year-olds Fixe Le Kap and **Protek Des Flos** are other possibles for the switch to fences.

Henderson added: "They're lovely, big horses, who love soft ground. These are smart juvenile hurdlers, but being precocious four-year-olds might as well get on with chasing now."

Breathing op for Peace

If Henderson produced the training performance of the campaign to get Sprinter Sacre back on track last term, he might have

to go one better if **Peace And Co** is to return to the level that had connections dreaming he could be the next Seven Barrows superstar.

He led home a memorable 1-2-3 for the trainer in the Triumph Hurdle in 2015 but failed to fire last season when he was expected to develop into a Champion Hurdle horse.

The plan is to remain over hurdles this term, and Henderson says: "He clearly has a ton of talent but he can be his own worst enemy at times and we're going to continue to experiment and tinker with things at home with a view to getting him back to his best.

"He's had a wind procedure this summer and I sincerely hope we can manage to get the real Peace And Co back for his owners Simon Munir and Isaac Souede.

"Interestingly, his mark is now down to 149 so if we can get him back on song we may try to go for a big handicap."

Hargam, third behind Peace And Co in the Triumph, could be in line for a step up in trip over hurdles, while Henderson reckons Cardinal Walter, who has been running respectably on the Flat this summer, has "a good race in him".

Champion aim again

My Tent Or Yours also did Henderson proud when returning from nearly two years off to finish a fine second to Annie Power in the Champion Hurdle.

"He's come back from Martinstown looking in exceptionally good order," says Henderson.

"I don't think novice chasing is really on



the agenda at this stage of his life and therefore we'll have to continue down the Champion Hurdle route. He's been a stalwart for so many years and I'm sure he retains his ability and enthusiasm."

Although Altior's win in the Supreme was Henderson's first in the race for 24 years, he is typically a force in the novice hurdling department and considers this autumn's crop to be a good squad of young horses.

The trainer says: "We had Altior last season and have got to find another one."

The obvious one

Jenkins, who won a bumper at Newbury before finishing second in the Land Rover edition at the Punchestown festival, is the "most obvious one", although Henderson plays down the significance of him sharing a field with Sprinter Sacre over the summer.

Baden, who also had solid form at Punchestown, is a novice from last term to note, as is **Consul De Thaix**, who ran in the Triumph, and **Khezerabad**, who was third in the Adonis.

Stowaway Magic did get off the mark over hurdles at Warwick in May but remains a novice the season, as does **Phobiaphiliac**, who struck at Southwell the same month.

The well-regarded and enthusiastic **Cultivator**, who runs in the Bobs Worth colours, also ran over hurdles in the spring, which Henderson believes he will have learned an "enormous amount" from, while **Rather Be**, not beaten far when ninth in the Champion Bumper at Cheltenham, is among a clutch of potential-packed youngsters ready to go hurdling.

They include River Wylde, Jameson, Thomas Campbell, Fly Camp and Christmas In April, who all created big impressions with wide-margin bumper victories.

Henderson is also looking forward to the return of **Gaitway** and **William Henry**, who have had time off, while **Minella Rebellion** and unrelated lookalikes **Lough Derg Farmer** and **Lough Derg Spirit** are point-to-point recruits to keep an eye on.

"You have a job telling them apart and they've got similar names," says the trainer. "They're likely types to appear shortly. Another point-to-pointer I like, but the commentators are going to hate, is **Claimantakinforgan**."

'She has everything'

Henderson usually has a strong squad of fillies and mares to go to war with and this season is no different.

Right at the top of the pecking order is French import **Kotkikova**, who has the Lambourn trainer purring.

Owned by JP McManus, the five-year-old has won 11 of her 14 starts including a Grade 1 over fences.

"She has absolutely everything," says Henderson. "She's the most gorgeouslooking mare, has a pedigree to die for and obviously a huge amount of talent. It's amazing what she's already achieved in such a short space of time.

"The plan at the moment would be to school her over British fences to see how she gets on and then make a decision as to which route, be it hurdling or chasing, that we take for this season. We're looking forward to her enormously."

Mares' aim for Mary

Bloody Mary, third in the inaugural running of the Grade 2 Trull House Stud



Mares' Novices' Hurdle at the Cheltenham Festival, is another McManus mare Henderson "loves", and plans are a little clearer for her with a hurdling campaign in the spring on the agenda.

Henderson says: "She had a knee injury following that Cheltenham race and it required surgery, so she'll be back later in the season. I'm pretty sure she'll improve for the break and I hope she'll be up to contesting the mares' Grade 1 at the festival in March if Kotkikova, in the same ownership, goes elsewhere.

"Bloody Mary is a great jumper of hurdles but fences might be a bit too much for her, although she is just the most lovely character."

Henderson's hopes of winning the festival's newest race this season appear to rest with **Kayf Grace**, who won the Grade 2 mares' bumper at Aintree, and **Theatre Territory**, who was 11th in that race.

Spectacular

"Kayf Grace put up a spectacular performance to win really nicely at Aintree," he says. "We have to hope she could be top class in the mares' novice division, while Theatre Territory didn't run so well at Aintree but is talented."

Southwell bumper winner

Scorpio Queen – "a lovely, big filly
with great scope, spectacular ears and a
great, honest look about her" – could also
come into that category, while Omessa

Has, who made the frame over fences at
Auteuil last year before arriving in Britain for
one run at Cheltenham in April, could go
chasing.

"I think you'll see the real Omessa Has this time." the trainer says.

THE LOWDOWN PHILIP HOBBS

Ton-up king out to beat handicapper for another big season

UCCESS comes at a price in racing. The handicapper sees to that, but trainer Philip Hobbs is used to having to deal with this scenario annually as he sends out over 100 winners with regularity.

To reach such heights each year, his Sandhill stables near Minehead in Somerset nurtures young talent to rise to the occasion backed by the old guard manfully struggling against the handicapping tide.

The retirement of the likes of Captain Chris and Balthazar King leaves 11-year-old Menorah king of the Sandhill castle after his rousing hat-trick in the Oaksey Chase at Sandown's season-ending meeting in April.

The campaign saw Hobbs again top £1 million in prize-money and made it a 12th season with scores over 100, with 113 his best in a decade.

Unsurprisingly, Hobbs says: "The Oaksey is very much on the agenda again. Menorah doesn't want soft ground and will probably run in the Charlie Hall again or the 3m chase at Ascot on the same day."

Two achievers straining against the handicapper's leashes are Village Vic and Sternrubin, who ended their successful seasons struggling at the highest level.

Village Vic rocketed 30lb in the weights for his four consecutive wins including two around the turn of the year at Cheltenham including the Grade 3 Caspian Caviar Gold Cup when still eight. In the rarefied air of the 150-plus-rated chasers he found the Ryanair a flight too far.

Sternrubin is only rising six but has paid for winning the Gerry Feilden and deadheating with Jolly's Cracked It in The Ladbroke at Ascot. Upped 20lb from his juvenile hurdling rating he found life tough in the County Hurdle at Cheltenham and the Scottish Champion Hurdle.

Hobbs said: "Both need to improve and with Sternrubin very high in the handicap over hurdles we might jump a fence with

It is a surprise if a big stable does not have a disappointment before the season gets into full swing and one such blow for Hobbs is the 2015 Swinton Hurdle winner War Sound missing the campaign. However, there are established performers and up-and-coming types in the yard.

Sausalito Sunrise was another top performer in the colours of long-time supporter Diana Whateley last season, and he could be even more high-profile this season with a possible big-race target next April.

He won the Grade 3 Murphy Group

Handicap Chase at Cheltenham in November and a Listed chase at Ascot in February but the eight-year-old signed off with a very good run in the bet365 Gold Cup at Sandown.

"He could be a Grand National horse if he mans up a bit," says Hobbs. "He's just a bit soft and needs to get a view of his fences and he doesn't want soft ground."

The Aintree marathon turned out not to be to the liking of **Kruzhlinin** after his good fifth in the Ultima Handicap Chase at the Cheltenham Festival.

It will be back to the more conventional races over 3m on decent ground, with a hint the nine-year-old is better going left-handed.

Royal Regatta had a little bit of an inand-out season as his trainer puts it, but managed a graduation chase win at Ascot in December before ending with a third to Silviniaco Conti in the Ascot Chase.

Hobbs hopes there is more still to come from this eight-year-old, and says: "He's a very big horse and has taken time to mature. He has undoubted ability and doesn't want the ground too soft."

Haldon aim for Victoire

Two who climbed the novice chase ranks last year were Garde La Victoire and Onenightinvienna, although both found it an unequal struggle at the end of the season.

Garde La Victoire won three novice chases but then his season fell apart albeit at the highest level in Grade 1 races at Cheltenham and Aintree. He had made a mistake or two in winning his three races, but sharing favouritism with winner Black Hercules he was still travelling strongly and

seemingly poised to pounce when falling four out in the JLT Novice Chase at the festival.

His confidence looked affected at Aintree in the Manifesto Novices' Chase as he made mistakes before falling at the fourth-last.

"He's a very good horse," said Hobbs. "The Haldon Gold Cup is the obvious race for him as there are usually not many runners and the fences are not stiff. He might have a run over hurdles beforehand."

Onenightinvienna paid for chasing home subsequent RSA Chase winner Blaklion at Cheltenham in December three weeks after winning a novice chase at Exeter. While his mark has eased 5lb from its opening 151, the seven-year-old is another who will need to improve to match his tasks.

Hobbs says: "With his high rating we ran

him in the Grand National which at the time we thought was a good idea but it was probably too much for the horse."


Novice chase team

As always, there is a new crop of novice chasers waiting in the wings and **Brother Tedd** will be one of the first to test the water with Hobbs looking to run him in October.

"He doesn't want the ground too soft and 2m4f is his trip," says the trainer.

Vieux Lille is another Hobbs hopes will step up over fences although the six-year-old paid his way as a novice hurdler with three wins and a third in the Rossington Main at Haydock.

"He had decent form but he's by Robin Des Champs and a 3m novice chase should be a better job for him."





Duke Des Champs is similarly a staying chaser in the making with Hobbs reporting: "He'll be going straight over fences and will end up in 3m races but will start over 2m4f to 2m6f. He's a big, strong horse who looks likely to be better over fences than he was over hurdles."

Braavos ended last season with a handicap hurdle win at Perth which saw his rating jump 10lb, and the five-year-old son of Presenting is earmarked for a switch to fences.

"He'll probably run in a hurdle race first and then go chasing. He doesn't want the ground too soft and will start off over 2m4f," says Hobbs.

Rock The Kasbah, winner of the Grade 3 Holloway's Hurdle at Ascot and beaten favourite in the Coral Cup at Cheltenham on the back of that, is an eyecatching convert to fences.

He is only six and brings a hurdle rating of 150 to the table which should ensure he gets respect in his early novice chases.

If In Doubt had his problems jumping fences and ended last season acquitting himself well back over hurdles, just a length off Pertemps Final success in third despite being hampered before running with credit at Aintree and Punchestown.

"Although he won chases he'll start back over hurdles," says Hobbs. "While he's gone up the handicap to 153 he wouldn't have to improve much to win 3m conditions hurdles."

Likely big improver

No Comment, like If In Doubt owned by JP McManus, already has a '1' against his name having won the 2m2f amateurs' bumper under Jamie Codd at Punchestown at the end of April. The five-year-old had previously shown his quality in finishing second in a bumper and novice hurdle.

"He's still a novice over hurdles for this season and could be a big improver with a bit of luck," says his trainer.

There has never been any hiding the high regard in which **Wait For Me** is held after

his third in the Cheltenham Champion Bumper to Moon Racer two years ago.

After two confidence-building wins he was fourth in the County Hurdle before disappointing in the Swinton last season.

"He was a bit disappointing as he never got his jumping together. He's a decent horse if we can get him back to his best."

Perform was kept out of action by a minor injury after winning a maiden hurdle at Aintree last October but is raring to go again.

"That was a decent novice hurdle," says Hobbs. And scrutiny of the form confirms just that as Knockgraffon and American, who finished second and third, scored on their next start.

Another hurdler to look out for is **Roll The Dough**, who won both starts for
Hobbs last October and November but missed
the rest of the season.

"He had a minor fracture of his pelvis but is fine now and hopefully he can go the right way with races over 2m4f and he might want 3m."

Gala Ball has won three hurdles but his trainer says: "He's still improving mentally and is rated 145. He'll start over 2m as he's got plenty of pace but will get further."

Prince can improve a lot

There is no lack of talent in this season's novice hurdle department.

Westend Story won his two bumpers to earn his place in the Cheltenham Champion Bumper and was an unlucky fifth at the festival, so is one to watch out for now he goes novice hurdling with 2m4f races the plan.

Bridge Of Spies is an interesting new recruit having been bought privately in the summer out of Ireland.

Hobbs says: "He's only five and won his Irish point. He has plenty of scope and I'm happy with him."

Another five-year-old and also a winner of an Irish point, **Lisheen Prince** is one to note as he showed distinct promise last November in a Cheltenham Listed bumper won by subsequent festival winner Ballyandy.

"He ran very well looking to have a chance coming down the hill," said Hobbs. "He ran up light after that and we gave him the whole year off. He's better for it and can improve a lot."

With the increase in mares only races there are two who could boost the stable tally.

Copper Kay won a Listed bumper at

Cheltenham and ran with credit in other big bumpers at Aintree and Punchestown.

Hobbs says: "She'll be going for novice hurdles over 2m4f and I hope with her level of form she could do well in the mares races."

Ready to make hay

Tearsofclewbay was another useful bumper performer and is another mare who could make hay against her own sex in 2m4f hurdle races this season.

The five-year-old won her first two bumpers and was only a couple of lengths behind well regarded The Nipper in a Listed mares' bumper at Sandown in March before running better than the form suggests in the Punchestown festival Listed mares' bumper.

Once again Hobbs looks to have all departments covered and with over 20 winners on the board since the official start of the season another three-figure score beckons.

THE LOWDOWN ALAN KING

Smad Hennessy-bound with star Yanworth set to remain over hurdles

winners on the board so far this season, Alan King has made a fine start to 2016-17 and the signs are good as his stars return to Barbury Castle and gear up for the winter.

Last season King had no finer stalwart than the flying grey **Smad Place**. Winning over £200,000 in prize-money with three victories, including a 12-length romp in the Hennessy, the nine-year-old had his best season yet over fences, improving a stone in the ratings having thrived under more positive tactics – and King is planning some more shots at the big prizes with him.

"We'll probably get him out at the end of October and start him off in the Charlie Hall Chase at Wetherby," says the trainer. "The main aim for him in the first half of the season will be the Hennessy."

While Smad Place hit the headlines for King among the staying chasers last term, the horse who really caught everyone's attention was **Yanworth**.

The JP McManus-owned six-year-old won four out of five starts in his first season hurdling with his only defeat coming at the festival when he found the Willie Mullins-

trained Yorkhill too good in the Neptune. Before that he had barely come off the bridle in his victories, two of which were achieved in Grade 2s.

Described by King in the past as frighteningly good and potentially very special, Yanworth will continue over hurdles for now.

"He could return at Ascot in the big 2m4f contest in November," says King. "We'll stick at around that trip for the time being and see how things pan out from there."

Another top novice hurdler for King last term was **Winter Escape**, who was unbeaten in all three starts, including the Grade 2 Dovecote at Kempton in February. Like Yanworth, King has described Winter Escape as "potentially very exciting" and he will continue over the smaller obstacles this season with a couple of valuable handicaps coming up being seen as potential targets.

"He could go to Ascot for the big handicap hurdle there at the end of October and then there's also the Greatwood at Cheltenham's Open meeting," says King.

Another JP star at Barbury Castle is **Uxizandre**. The 2015 Ryanair Chase hero – AP McCoy's final winner at the festival – missed last season but could return this term and is due back in in October according to the trainer

Another big name who was not seen last

"He's back in work and the plan is to go chasing with him," says King, who is also pleased to have his talented eight-year-old **Carraig Mor** back in again following a year off. A Grade 2 winner over fences and always highly regarded, he has started cantering but nothing is set in stone for his return to the racetrack just yet.

Promising juvenile team

Always a force with his horses in the juvenile division, King had three around the 140 mark last season, all of whom ran in the Triumph Hurdle.

The one who fared best at the festival was **Gibralfaro**, who had been rated as high as 151 by the handicapper following two wins earlier in the season.

may consider sending over fences at some stage," says King.

"Sceau Royal will continue hurdling and we plan to start him off in October. There's a limited handicap at Chepstow and also a race we can look at at Cheltenham."

King will also be looking at handicap hurdles for Who Dares Wins, who has been racing on the Flat recently. The Henry Ponsonby-owned gelding was one of numerous winners during the summer for King, who enjoyed one of his best spells on the Flat yet in 2016, including a Royal Ascot success.

Another festival victory came at York's Ebor meeting with Oceane, who is one of the market leaders for the Cesarewitch at the time of writing. He is rated as high as 134 over hurdles at present and the four-year-old is likely to go back over the smaller obstacles at some stage.

"He must have good ground so we'll



Other fair Flat performers who could try their hand over the smaller obstacles are **Top Tug**, who could be set to go novice hurdling, while **Cosmeapolitan** and Melrose Stakes fourth **Master Blueyes** are set for the juvenile division.

Talented youngsters

Two youngsters King will have high hopes for in novice hurdles this season are **Messire Des Obeaux** and **Criq Rock**. The former performed well at the Cheltenham Festival last term when seventh in the Fred Winter, and King says: "As he remains a novice we'll continue down that route and he's one we're

looking forward to. We'll be looking at a stiff two miles for Criq Rock and again he's exciting." The five-year-old won twice in bumpers last autumn and is clearly well regarded.

The novice chase team will be set to include **Label Des Obeaux**. "He'll be going over fences this term, probably staying at around two and a half miles. That'll also be the trip for **Big Chief Benny**, although he'll be staying over hurdles for now. He's a nice prospect. **William H Bonney** is similar. Only a five-year-old, he'll build on his experience from running in the Supreme Novices' last term and remain hurdling."

The only news of any delay comes with King's top mare **Katie Too**, who was good enough to win a Listed event at Cheltenham against her own sex in April.

"She's had a setback so is set to be out until the second half of the season," says King, who is hoping for a similar winter to last term which saw him win big races like the Paddy Power, Hennessy and Great Yorkshire. A few more prizes like those coming his way would be just the ticket.

THE LOWDOWN WILLIE MULLINS

Faugheen recovered, Annie looking fantastic - it's time for takeoff

ILLIE MULLINS' stable stars have so much underneath the bonnet that the running joke between many of the staff working in Closutton is that their place of employment is more akin to an airport rather than a racehorse stable.

Who could blame them? Horses seem to be jetting off to far flung places to run big races in the Melbourne Cup, Nakayama Grand Jump and even French Champion Hurdles.

Fresh from adding his first Classic success following Wicklow Brave's victory in the Irish St Leger, the man entrusted with playing air traffic controller in County Carlow admits the vard does resemble an airport, but for different reasons to what one may have expected.

"It's true that we do call some of the barns terminals but I think that was more a reflection on the fact that the horses went a little over budget and it wasn't necessarily anything to do with the machines that were in the boxes," Mullins jokes.

Keeping those machines purring nicely and mapping out plans for the season is at the top of a very long priority list for the champion trainer, and one such machine he is delighted to have back in his barn is Faugheen.

"He's good and strong and we hope to have a trouble-free year with him. He's made a full recovery from his injury and is back in full training," says Mullins.

"We're in a position most people wouldn't have been with previous Champion Hurdle winners in that we know he stays and jumps, so he could go novice chasing, because he's a point-to-point winner. At the moment, though, that isn't on the agenda. We saw last year how important it can be to have a bit of depth to the Champion Hurdle team, and he'll be an important member of that team."

Annie Power was one of those spares who filled the shoes of Faugheen to retain the Champion Hurdle for her owner Rich Ricci last season, and she could be back to defend her crown at Cheltenham in March.

"I'm delighted she did what she did last year. She's another who has the ability to go novice chasing but might stay down the hurdle route now. She has lots of different options from the Champion Hurdle, to the World Hurdle and even the Mares' Hurdle. The most important thing is that she's come back looking fantastic and we can't wait to get her going again."

Of the rest of his Champion Hurdle hand, Arctic Fire is most likely to be seen in the middle to late part of the season while Apple's Jade could improve enough to be considered good enough for the better 2m races.

DID YOU KNOW?

Willie Mullins nearly became the first Irish trainer since Vincent O'Brien to win the British jumps trainers' title last season, but he was just pipped at the post by Paul Nicholls, Mullins had 27 winners in Britain, incredibly amassing well over £2 million in prize-money. In Ireland he won well over £3 million with a whopping 185 winners. But that's still short of his record tally in his homeland which was the 193 winners he accrued in 2012-13

racingpost.com racingpost.com Punchestown Champion Hurdle scorer **Vroum Vroum Mag**, who is yet to taste defeat for Mullins, will have a multitude of options too.

"It was pleasing the way she adapted to jumping hurdles as quickly as she did, as we must remember most of her form was over fences," says Mullins.

"It makes her very versatile, so we can go a number of directions with her now, although we don't have any concrete plans for her just yet."

Yorkhill could stick to hurdles

One surprise nomination for the Champion Hurdle from Mullins is **Yorkhill**, who was the subject of a famous quote from Ruby Walsh after his win in last season's Neptune Novices' Hurdle at Cheltenham.

"Yes, Ruby did say he would win the Arkle, but you could look at Yorkhill and think if another owner had him, you might say he's a Champion Hurdle type. We probably said we were going to go chasing at the end of last season, but I wouldn't bet my life on it. I wouldn't be ruling anything out and he could have a very good career over hurdles."

Mullins insists he doesn't have favourites and concentrates on the team as opposed to individuals. One individual who looks to be en route to superstardom, and may even perhaps change Mullins' stance on having favourites in the yard, is the unbeaten **Douvan**.

"He's very good. He looks a natural and the Queen Mother Champion Chase over two miles looks like a good target for him."

It's unlikely **Nichols Canyon** will be campaigned over the minimum trip this season, with the World Hurdle at Cheltenham his ultimate aim. He could be joined there by **Shaneshill**, who was in the process of running a massive race before coming down at the last flight in the Grade 1 Stayers' Hurdle at Punchestown.

Mullins' possible Champion Hurdle hand is only rivalled for strength in depth for what he may be prepared to hurl into battle for the Gold Cup, one of the only major races the nine-time Irish Champion trainer has yet to win.

More to come from Djakadam

Djakadam has found just one too good in the last two Gold Cups, and Mullins believes the seven-year-old is still on the improve.

"He's going to be stronger again this year. I imagine we'll be going down the Gold Cup route, but if his running tells us during the season that he may benefit from dropping in trip, then we'll have to explore those other options. I think he can continue to improve and we mustn't forget he's still a young horse."

Vautour could go for gold

Perhaps one of the liveliest debates of last season revolved around **Vautour** and whether the three-time Cheltenham Festival winner would stay the Gold Cup trip – and Mullins looks like he will be providing us with plenty to talk about again this season.

"Vautour has come back in looking very well and I imagine he'll have a similar programme to last year," the trainer says.

"I can't see us changing much as regards his build-up to Cheltenham. There's a different school of thought regarding his ability to stay. He can be very difficult to train at times, but if we get a straighter run with him this year, he is Gold Cup material. He has lots of speed and can come back in trip to the Ryanair. I think he has huge ability."

Don Poli will also have a similar campaign to last season and will be aimed at the Lexus Chase as well as the Irish Gold Cup before another crack at the Cheltenham Gold Cup, while Valseur Lido is another exciting Gigginstown House Stud-owned staying chaser to go to war with.

There is no shortage of horses who could step up to the plate to have a major say in the Ryanair Chase, or even add to the stable's strong Gold Cup challenge. One is **Black Hercules**, who won every race he stood up in last season, culminating with a superb three-length success in the JLT Novices' Chase.

"He'll be sticking to middle distances and the Ryanair could be the ultimate aim for him. He was very good at Cheltenham and that was a late decision to run him in

the JLT instead of the four-miler, which paid off."

'Hugely exciting prospect'

Killultagh Vic would have been many people's idea of the JLT winner before picking up an injury in the build-up to Cheltenham last year, but Mullins is quietly confident he can get the seven-year-old back to full fitness.

"He's going to come back into training a little late so we'll probably see him in the middle or the second half of the season. If we can get him back to his best he'll be a hugely exciting prospect as he has a lot of ability."

The search is always on for young horses capable of making the progression from the novice chase ranks into the senior chase brigade, but Mullins will feel he has unfinished business with Un De Sceaux and Champagne Fever, and perhaps now is the time for both of those to deliver on their ability.

Sceaux and Fever to mix it up

"Un De Sceaux looks as though he's maturing in his racing and that he may be able to get a longer trip now. He had a tough task at the end of the season when we asked him to run in the French Champion Hurdle. He'll win over the minimum trip, but we're probably thinking of running him over middle distance races as 2m4f looks like it's his optimum now. He could also go back over hurdles as well.

"As for **Champagne Fever**, he'll also mix it between hurdles and fences. He looks to be in good order at home so that's pleasing."

Novice chases for Min

Min arrived at Closutton from France with a big reputation and his only defeat under the care of Mullins came when finding Altior seven lengths too strong in the Supreme Novices' Hurdle.

"He'll go chasing. I thought the winner looked very good in the Supreme and we ran well enough to finish second. Maybe he was just beaten by a good horse in Altior, as if the winner wasn't in there, our fella would have looked good. I think Min will improve and he has more maturing to do still."

Up For Review and Petit Mouchoir are others for the novice chase notebook. Up For Review will be starting off over 2m4f to 3m and his main aim could be something like the four-miler at Cheltenham, while Petit Mouchoir is slowly maturing and getting the hang of racing.

With a maiden win over 1m5½ fon the Flat in the French provinces, **Senewalk** is now with Mullins and, despite having yet to jump

Champagne Fever is in good order at home and will be mixing chasing with hurdling, while Killultagh Vic (above) is likely to return in the second half the season a hurdle in public, already sits at the head of the betting for the Supreme Novices' next March. He has reportedly come back in from grass looking great and is doing all of the right things on the gallops.

Big future for Footpad

Asked to put forward some slightly darker horses, Mullins nominates the four-year-old Footpad, last season's Cheltenham Bumper fourth Castello Sforza and runaway Galway bumper winner Queen Deirdre.

"We'll certainly be looking at the French programme for **Footpad**, and you could even see him jump a fence this season or next. He has a big future. "Castello Sforza was very impressive when he won his first start at Fairyhouse two seasons back. He's had a few issues which held him up last year and he only ran once, when doing well in the Champion Bumper. We said we'd keep him as a novice for this year over hurdles. He has plenty of gears.

"You can't forget about **Queen Deirdre** either. It's a bit early for us to be talking about bumper horses, but she was very good at Galway, winning by 12 lengths. We'll keep her to her own sex for now and she could go to Gowran Park or even on to Navan next."

Mullins also outlines the mares' novice hurdle at Cheltenham for **Augusta Kate** and **Limini**.



Last season's bumper horses acquitted themselves well, with the highlight being **Blow By Blow** landing the Punchestown Champion Bumper under Katie Walsh.

"He should handle good ground being by Robin Des Champs, but he's massive and looks every inch a chaser. He'll be a lovely horse to contest staying novice hurdles this season. He improved with every run last year and showed us plenty at home so he's exciting."

Battleford was a narrow loser in the Cheltenham bumper, and Mullins believes he is another bumper horse from last season to keep a watchful eye on, along with Invitation Only and Bacardys.

"We're looking forward to

Title talk

Not only did Mullins dominate the Irish scene last season, and indeed every season since winning his first trainers' championship in 2007, but a first British trainers' championship almost went his way following his big-race exploits across the water.

Asked whether he will be targeting the British title this season Mullins says: "It's not something we're going to set out to do. If it happens, then so be it. You need a lot of luck. Last year lots of things went right for us and it was certainly achievable.

"We'll be preparing our horses the way we normally do and if the opportunities arise, then we will try and take them as they come." *Interview by Brian Sheerin*

THE LOWDOWN PAUL NICHOLLS

Overwhelming amount of talent suggests it's going to be epic again

URING an epic campaign in which Paul Nicholls won the trainers' title on the final day of the season, his solitary Grade 1 win over fences came courtesy of Silviniaco Conti in the Ascot Chase. While the ten-year-old's best days may be behind him, he is still capable of high-class form and will bid for an eighth Grade 1 win over fences in the Champion Chase at Down Royal on November 5.

His trainer says: "Apart from when we had **Silviniaco Conti** right for Ascot, last season was an absolute nightmare. But he's looking a lot better physically than he did this time last year, so we'll get him spot-on for Down Royal and then form a plan for the rest of the season."

With Saphir Du Rheu failing to live up to the lofty hopes entertained for him this time last year and former champion chaser Dodging Bullets looking to have lost a bit of his speed, the spotlight is on the up-and-coming chasers and Nicholls is hopeful **Le Mercurey** could improve in his second season.

He says of the two-time Grade 2 winner:

"His first target is the Grade 2 chase at Down Royal on November 5, where the flat track should suit. He was getting a bit lazy last season – he virtually pulled himself up in front in the Reynoldstown – but we stuck the blinkers on at Ayr and he won impressively."

So what of **Saphir Du Rheu**? "After his Carlisle win last autumn I thought he had the chasing world at his feet, but things didn't go right after that," says Nicholls. "He was stopping abruptly in his races, so we gave him a soft-palate operation, and I hope a nice summer break will have helped. All I can say is I'll be disappointed if last season is as good as he is."

Dodging Bullets was not without his problems either, being forced to sit out the first half of the season with a splint.

"He ran no race in defence of his two-mile chase crown but his Celebration Chase third was more encouraging," says the trainer. "However, the speed he once had doesn't seem to be there any more, so we'll look to step him up in trip. There are no firm plans but I can see him getting a King George entry."

Haldon Gold Cup winner **Vibrato Valtat** went on to run well in Graded company but proved hard to place, and Nicholls says: "Life isn't easy for him, so we might try stepping him up in distance. He could start off back in the Haldon Gold Cup again."

Grand National hopes

A new handicap chasing star emerged in the spring in the shape of Vicente. Who could have foreseen, when he became the yard's first winner of last season in a beginners' chase at Newton Abbot in April, that almost a year later he'd be galloping to victory in the Scottish Grand National?

Nicholls describes it as "a fairytale" and adds a tilt at the Grand National could now be on the cards, although he warns life won't be so easy off a revised handicap mark.

A National entry could also be handed to the luckless Virak, who rarely ran a bad race last season but kept bumping into betterhandicapped rivals.

The progressive Vivaldi Collonges is another to look out for in big long-distance handicap chases. He jumped his rivals ragged in three victories last season and the Becher Chase at Aintree is a possible big-race pre-Christmas target.

Another likely improver this winter is Art Mauresque. Despite a busy season he held his form well and Nicholls says: "Now he's learned to relax he's progressing all the time. He starts on quite a high mark, but we'll see how he gets on in the Old Roan Chase at Aintree."

We are warned not to rule out further chasing success for Southfield Theatre. After struggling in the first half of last season, his fourth in the bet365 Gold Cup was far more like it and Nicholls says: "There's still a big race to be won with this horse."

The talented but luckless Bouvreuil should be competitive in handicaps. A runner-up at the last two Cheltenham Festivals, he travels well in his races and his assured jumping will stand him in good

Sound Investment, who shot up the ratings on the back of a string of high-class efforts, has recovered from a small tendon injury, and another who has been on the sidelines is Sametegal. But he should be back later on and is one to look out for on good spring ground over 2m4f.

Exciting times

Nothing went right for **Aux Ptits Soins** last season. Plagued with sinus problems in the first half of the campaign that required several bouts of surgery, he finally came right but had to go to the World Hurdle without a prep, so in the circumstances he ran well before getting tired.

Nicholls says: "He took a long time to get over that, but has enjoyed a nice summer break and remains an exciting prospect for novice chases. He should be ready to debut in a beginners' chase towards the end of November."

The six-year-old's owner John Hales has two other smart prospects in Politologue and Ibis Du Rheu. In a slightly up-and-down season, **Politologue** finished second in the Grade 1 Challow Hurdle but was over the top when down the field in the Coral Cup.

Nicholls predicts: "He's yet to fully develop and I've no doubt his best days are ahead of him over fences."

Ibis Du Rheu atoned for a narrow defeat in the Lanzarote Hurdle when landing the Martin Pipe Handicap Hurdle at Cheltenham. He too is still maturing physically and is taking a bit longer than the others to come to hand, but a switch to fences will be awaited with keen interest.

Guard in fantastic order

Nicholls does not attempt to hide his enthusiasm when talking about Old Guard. The five-year-old improved rapidly last autumn, winning the Greatwood and International Hurdle, but Nicholls says: "Things went wrong from then. I ran him too soon at Kempton and then he suffered a pelvic injury. But he's in fantastic order and I can't wait to see him jump a fence. He's Flatbred but tough enough for chasing and I see him in the mould of Dodging Bullets."

> Plans are fluid but there remains the possibility he might have one more outing over hurdles first.

Improving young hurdler Le Prezien was sold to JP McManus for £290,000 at the end of his novice campaign and big things are expected once he embarks on a chasing career.

"He was a star for us last season," says Nicholls, "ending with a career-best second behind Yorkhill. He's done very well over the summer and if he continues his improvement he could be a really good novice chaser for us this winter."

Fresh from a season that netted three victories, two in decent handicaps, The Eaglehaslanded now has his attentions turned to fences and his trainer predicts: "Three miles should bring out the best in him and I can see him developing into a good staving chaser."

The talented but frustrating Arpege D'Alene still has a bright future over fences according to his trainer, provided his jumping can be sorted out, and "a pair of cheekpieces might help".

The equally frustrating As De Mee can surely put his experience to good use in his second season over fences.

Nicholls says: "We'll start low down and work up. He's capable of landing a good handicap at some stage and will get an entry in the BetVictorGold Cup."

Once the ex-French **Mr Mix** got the hang



up the steep gallop at Ditcheat

The ten-time champion trainer has reached over £2 million in prize-money for 13 consecutive seasons. On four of those occasions he has surpassed the £3m barrier - in 2008, 2009, 2012 and 2015. It was See More Indians who also gave Nicholls his first Grade 1 success when winning the Feltham Novices' Chase at Kempton in 1993.



quickly over hurdles and he was still far from done with when falling in the conditional riders' handicap at the festival. Still lightly raced, he will probably switch to fences, but not before he has had a crack at Chepstow's Silver Trophy Hurdle.

The one-time frustrating **Emerging Talent** finally got his act together over hurdles last season and is regarded as a good chasing prospect "if he proves tough enough for the job".

Former festival winner **Qualando** found life harder in his second season, but once he fills his ever-expanding frame he is expected to show a useful level of form over fences.

Warriors Tale was an in-and-out performer last season but a summer breathing operation could lead to greater consistency.

Ptit Zig staying over hurdles

French Champion Hurdle winner **Ptit Zig** will head back across the Channel in November for a tilt at the country's other championship Grade 1, the Grand Prix d'Automne.

Although the seven-year-old boasts high-

class form over fences, Nicholls says: "It's clear he's better over hurdles, so we'll stick to them now. After Auteuil he'll be aimed at the Long Walk."

The hurdling division is strengthened by a crack team of second-season four-year-olds. **Adrien Du Pont** became the yard's sole Grade 1 winner over hurdles last winter when landing the Finale at Chepstow.

Nicholls reckons there is further improvement to come and rates him a smart prospect, saying: "He'll get an entry for the four-year-olds' Champion Hurdle [Prix Renaud du Vivier] at Auteuil in November."

'He's got masses of improvement'

Another possible for that French Grade 1 is **Zubayr**. Winner of the Grade 2 Adonis on his debut, he found the Triumph coming too soon but showed his true colours when third to the smart Footpad in France.

Nicholls says: "There's no doubt in my mind he's got masses of improvement in him. We could go back to Auteuil in November or go for a decent handicap as he could be on an attractive mark [143]."

Rated 9lb lower than Adrien Du Pont on

138 is Fred Winter Handicap Hurdle winner **Diego Du Charmil**, and off that mark his trainer believes he could be competitive in something like the Greatwood Hurdle. Whatever this horse achieves this season – and four-year-olds often struggle in their second campaign – his size suggests he will come into his own over fences, although that is unlikely to be for another 12 months.

Considering chasing was always going to be **Clan Des Obeaux's** game, he did not fare badly when sixth in the Triumph Hurdle. Although four-year-olds get a much-reduced allowance over fences nowadays, this one is likely to make the switch and is clearly one of the trainer's favourites.

"He's one I really like and he's done so well physically," says Nicholls.

One place behind Clan Des Obeaux in the Triumph was **Tommy Silver**, a massive horse who can only progress as he strengthens up. "I hope there's lots of improvement to come from this one." his trainer said.

Connetable, winner of the Contenders Hurdle at Sandown on soft ground, later struggled on a quicker surface and Nicholls is planning a step up in trip.

More to come from Silsol

Among the older campaigners, none comes tougher or more consistent than seven-year-old **Silsol**, who reverted to hurdles after winning twice over fences and ended on a career-high mark after finishing third in Graded company at Aintree.

"There's more to come from him in staying hurdles," says the trainer.

Improving five-year-old **All Set To Go** is expected to continue his progress through the handicapping ranks having finished runner-up in the Swinton Hurdle in May.

Irving went off the boil after a valuable success at Haydock. The aim is to get this talented but frustrating performer back in A1 condition to add to his tally of four victories in Graded company. He is best in the first half of the season.

Capitaine tops novice hurdle list

The spotlight this winter will be on youth, with no fewer than 55 horses bound for juvenile or novice hurdles. One of the features of last season was a late flurry of bumper winners and a host of them are now



expected to do well over hurdles.

One of the best could be **Capitaine**, described by Nicholls as "the apple of my eye ever since he arrived from France".

A runaway Wincanton success in April, which has been followed by slick schooling, suggests the four-year-old could take high rank.

Visually even more impressive a few days earlier was **Brahms De Clermont**, a five-year-old from the family of Master Minded who put 16 lengths between himself and his Taunton rivals, despite running green.

The trainer says: "He gave Sean Bowen a great feel and looked as if he could go round again. His schooling since has been very good."

Either Brahms De Clermont or Capitaine could first take in the valuable bumper at the Cheltenham Open meeting.

Also successful at Wincanton was **Movewiththetimes**. The trainer says: "He'd been working just about as well as any of our bumper horses, so it was no surprise to see him win what could have been a warm contest. Tom George trained the runner-up in both divisions of that bumper and he fancied his pair, so the form could be okay. Movewiththetimes has progressed nicely since and jumps well."

Nicholls had a virtual monopoly on the spring bumpers at his local track and he had been successful in both divisions at the previous fixture with a promising pair owned by Trevor Hemmings. **Touch Kick**, a son of Presenting from the family of Big Buck's, gave the impression he'll be suited by further than 2m over hurdles, as should **Winningtry**, who may have another bumper run first.

Gibbes Bay was bought at last December's Cheltenham breeze-up sale as a future chaser, but judged on his Ayr bumper success on Scottish National day there are novice hurdles to be won with him first.

Packed with potential

There is no disguising the trainer's liking for **Capeland**, who won a Listed bumper at Cheltenham on New Year's Day on his only run last season.

Nicholls says: "We've looked after him with the future in mind and he's enjoyed an excellent summer. He has bags of potential and should be out in mid-October."

There is similar enthusiasm for Give Me A



Copper, a £270,000 buy at the Goffs UK Aintree sale in April. This point-to-point and bumper winner has done plenty of work and should make his mark in staying novice burdles.

Another to have reportedly done well is the ex-French **Cash Again**, second to the smart Jenkins at Newbury on his debut for the yard.

Nicholls says: "The form has been franked, he's summered well and I expect him to make a decent novice."

Summer stars

The vastly improved pair **El Bandit** and **Bagad Bihoue** carried all before them during the summer, unbeaten in their six outings, and both could take their chance in the Persian War Novices' Hurdle at Chepstow.

Coup De Pinceau has not been rushed, but there was a lot to like about his Ludlow debut success in April. "He's done very well physically and jumps nicely," says Nicholls.

Brio Conti has needed more time than some of the others but a Stratford bumper success in May suggests he is now ready to start repaying the patience.

Captain Buck's was also given time to mature. A heavy-ground winner at Taunton in February, he got caught out on a quicker surface back there in April and will be suited by 2m4f over hurdles.

Old favourites

It is welcome back to a host of well-known faces at Nicholls' Somerset yard, none more so than **Zarkandar**, one of the stable stars over the last few years who was forced to miss a year after being injured in the 2015 French Champion Hurdle.

"It's hard at this stage to tell if all the old ability is still there," says the trainer, "but he's been doing loads of work and showing all his usual enthusiasm. Provided he stays sound, the Long Distance Hurdle at Newbury is a possible starting point."

A tendon injury also halted the career of 2014 Cheltenham Festival winner **Lac**

Fontana. He is due to go novice chasing and could be interesting.

The 2014 Paddy Power Gold Cup winner **Caid Du Berlais** has been off for 12 months with a leg problem. Only five at the time of his Cheltenham success, he had time to mature physically during his year off and he is a classy performer when on his A-game.

"He won't be easy to place and could begin in a 3m hurdle," says Nicholls.

Hopes are high that former classy novice chaser **Irish Saint** has retained all his ability after a layoff. "He could make up into a smart performer over staying distances, starting at the end of October," says the trainer.

The likeable **Far West**, a real favourite in the yard, is being primed to give his syndicate some more fun days out. If the old ability is still there he is tipped to pick up a decent prize over fences somewhere along the line.

Earthmoves was found to have injured a leg after disappointing on his return last October. The trainer says: "He's done well for a break, maturing physically, and remains a horse with potential over fences. He has a date over hurdles at Chepstow first, in the Silver Trophy."

Grade 3-placed hurdler **Great Try** always shaped as though he would improve for fences and now he has recovered from a tendon injury he will get the chance to prove it.

Persian Delight was not disgraced in a Grade 2 bumper at Aintree two seasons ago. He was given plenty of time to recover after a small hole was found in a tendon and is now expected to make up into a decent staying novice hurdler.

New blood

Expect **Dolos** to make his mark early. Third on his only run for Guillaume Macaire in the influential Prix Wild Monarch, he could go to the first Chepstow meeting.

Also expected out next month is **Divin Bere**, a maiden on the Flat after nine outings
but much improved over hurdles, winning at
Lyon and second twice at Auteuil in April.

Two other three-year-olds to note are

Darling Maltaix, whose sharp turn of foot enabled him to win a bumper at Vichy on his only run in May, and **Wealth Des Mottes**. He impressed when making a successful hurdling debut at Clairefontaine in Deauville in July, although Paul Nicholls warns: "He may want a bit of time to grow up."

Among the new four-year-olds, **Casko D'Airy** "looks an old-fashioned chasing sort who will appreciate a trip", while **Contre Tous** was a bumper winner who has been placed over hurdles.

There is a good word for **Peak To Peak**, who is by Authorized, the same sire as Nicholls' smart young hurdler Zubayr. He joined the yard before last Christmas after winning on the Flat.

More a name to note for the future is **Cyrname**, a fine, big son of Nickname who bolted up at Pau and will come into his own when sent over fences.

'One of my favourites'

French bumper winner **Copain De Classe** has needed plenty of time to develop but is

now progressing nicely and we should see a better horse over hurdles this season.

"As a physical model he'd be one of my favourites," says Nicholls.

Pilansberg came to Ditcheat with smart French Flat form but disappointed on his only run, which followed a busy campaign across the Channel. A gelding operation, plus a good summer break, has done him the world of good.

Brelan D'As ran a shocker on his only run in Britain but the word is: "You'll see a different animal this time". The same applies to Crin Au Vent, who did not fare any better on his sole outing, but Nicholls advises: "Put a line through it. He'll be a very different proposition now."

Clic Work had a breathing operation over the summer and his trainer reckons he could be fairly handicapped on 123, provided he learns to settle better.

Goffs purchase working well

The huge **Topofthegame** changed hands for £120,000 at the Goffs UK Aintree sale

First lot leaves the main yard on a typical morning at Manor Farm Stables

after making all to run out an impressive winner of an Irish maiden point-to-point in March. Despite his size, he has schooled well over hurdles according to his trainer.

Although early days, Nicholls is "very pleased" with **One More Hero**, who looked a real staying prospect when winning at Dromahane. He will relish a trip over hurdles.

The trainer appears equally sweet on Irish maiden point winner **Secret Investor**. "He has real presence and I'm thrilled with him, but we'll need to look after him and give him time to develop as he's a lovely prospect further down the line."

Blackwater Bramble, another winner at Dromahane, "will be ready early on to hopefully take advantage of some good ground".

A number of horses have come via Jack Barber's point-to-point academy at Seaborough in Dorset.

Rouge Devils was very green in a bumper for Nicholls last October, but a spell pointing led to him winning twice for Barber and he can continue to progress in staying novice hurdles on good ground.

Also on the green side up to now has been **The Happy Chappy**, but that did not stop him winning both starts. Other dual winners to note are **San Satiro**, who looked a thorough stayer when successful at Cotley and the Berkeley, and **Overland Flyer**, who has had a soft palate operation.

Bistouri D'Honore is a maiden in the pointing sphere but it was only by a whisker that he was beaten at the Berkeley and this fine, big son of Ballingarry looks the part.

Minella Rocco leading charge to become next star at Jackdaws Castle

T WAS far from Jonjo O'Neill's worst season but the head of Jackdaws Castle is keen to improve on his 2015-16 showing this time around.

O'Neill notched 81 winners last term, bringing in prize-money a shade shy of £850,000 but was left with a feeling of what might have been had his summer dreams of

Holywell and More Of That come to life.

Instead, his stable stars could not hit the heights and his only Graded success came courtesy of Eastlake in the Topham Chase at Aintree in April.

"Last season was okay but we'd have liked to have done better," O'Neill says. "If your superstars don't perform or they aren't good enough, that's just the way it works out.

"That said, when you're looking at things you want to achieve, you'd want a winner at Cheltenham, a winner at Aintree, which we 'Everybody

Jonjo was a great jump jockey, amassing over 900 winners. His finest hour in the saddle came when he rode Dawn Run to victory in the 1986 Cheltenham Gold Cup, while he was twice champion jockey in 1978 and 1980. As a trainer he has won the Gold Cup and Grand National and is the only person to register a seasonal tally of 100 winners as a jockey and a trainer.

did last year, so that was good even though we didn't get the 100 winners.

"Everybody wants to get 100 winners and win £1 million in prize-money, but it's easier said than done. I've been in the game long enough to know it's up and down and I'm looking forward to a good year."

O'Neill's excitement as the autumn draws in is palpable, his passion for what lies ahead unmistakable.

"This is a great time of the year," he enthuses. "All the horses look great and the whole yard is excited. It's probably the best time because there are no disappointments yet."

One horse accounting for a good deal of that optimism is **Minella Rocco**, a strapping six-year-old for whom the sky appears to be the limit after an excellent victory in the National Hunt Chase at the Cheltenham Festival.

Colin Tizzard is already dreaming of the Gold Cup for Native River, who chased Minella Rocco home that day in March but O'Neill does not want to get carried away yet with a horse who could prove a leading

Grand National contender in time.

"He's doing well," O'Neill says. "There's a few handicap chases he could go for to begin with, to see whether he's improved and how he's coping with things. He's rated 155, so he'd need to improve a bit before we can think about better races but I hope he's got that in him.

"He's a big baby of a horse, a massive thing at 17.1 and you'd hope he can improve. He's done very well to have done what he's done up to now, so hopefully with another summer on his back, he can come on again."

Holywell return delayed

O'Neill, who won the 2012 Gold Cup with Synchronised, will be hoping Minella Rocco could prove his latest contender for that great race, with **Holywell's** chances of elevating himself to that level now seemingly gone.

The nine-year-old finished fourth behind Coneygree in the 2015 Gold Cup and did not contest the race last season, instead finishing second in the Grade 3 Ultima Handicap Chase at the festival.

snag, O'Neill reveals, with the diminutive star having spent his summer overcoming colic that will delay his return to action.

"It took him a little while to get over but he's fine again now," says O'Neill. "We were hoping to get him out reasonably early but we're taking it easy with him now. He'll be out before Christmas but quite when, we don't know."

Wherever Holywell ends up racing, it will not be in the Grand National, in which he fell this year having not taken to the unique test.

"He's a great little horse but he didn't like Aintree at all," O'Neill explains. "They either love it or hate it and we weren't sure with him but he definitely hated it.

"He'll go for the long-distance chases but he's very high in the weights for a little horse, so he struggles to give it away. If we go for a Grade 1 he's probably not quite good enough, so we're in between the two."

Another wind op for RSA third

Another who ultimately failed to hit the heights expected of him last season was **More Of That** although he had excuses

having bled when finishing third in the RSA Chase.

"He did nothing wrong at Cheltenham, he just bled. These things happen," says O'Neill, who stresses he has no thoughts of returning to hurdles with the 2014 World Hurdle winner.

"We think the bleeding may have been down to his wind, so he's had another wind operation. Hopefully, it's onwards and upwards for him now."

Taquin in good shape

The trainer hopes the same can be said for **Taquin Du Seuil**, who has struggled since winning the JLT Novices' Chase at the festival in 2014.

Now nine, this huge horse is set to be given the chance to prove himself outside of novice company once again, with the BetVictor Gold Cup a potential early opportunity.

"He's summered well and we might have a go at something like the BetVictor," O'Neill



says. "He just didn't have the best season last year but you often get that in the novice years. He's a grand horse."

Should he end up heading to Cheltenham's early-season showpiece, Taquin Du Seuil could find himself, of course, up against stablemate Johns Spirit.

It is becoming hard to imagine racing at the famous old venue without the nine-yearold and while O'Neill is aware the seven-time winner is not getting any younger, he is hopeful there are more big days in the popular bay yet.

"He's another one for the BetVictor, I'd imagine," says the trainer. "We've tried him at three miles but he doesn't seem to get it, so we'll have to go back to those good handicaps

"The problem is he's getting a bit older now, so whether he still has the fire in his belly I don't know. He looks great though."

One to emerge from the 2015-16 campaign on more of a positive note was Eastlake, not the most straightforward horse in training but a talented one nonetheless and one who opened up options available with his victory in the Topham.

O'Neill says: "We're going to go back to the Becher. He'd never won any further than two miles until he won the Topham, so we'll give him a try and see how we get on."

If Eastlake can prove himself a contender for the big staying handicaps, he will be joining a host of stablemates whose seasons are set to revolve around these sorts of races - some well established names and others emerging on the scene.

It won't be third time lucky

Perhaps the best known of them is Shutthefrontdoor, who has finished in the top ten in the last two Grand Nationals but is unlikely to have another go, with O'Neill not convinced the marathon trip is to his liking.

is reluctant to have a third crack at the Grand National



"He ran a great race in the National but for me, he doesn't quite get the trip," he says. "He'll be going for those long-distance races again but maybe not quite as long as that."

Shutthefrontdoor has an Irish Grand National victory on his CV, and **Another Hero** could be campaigned to have a second shot at emulating his stablemate, having fallen at Fairyhouse at his first shot.

"He's back in again but I'm not sure if there's much improvement in him," says O'Neill. "He'll be going for the same sort of races again and he's done nothing wrong."

In the Scottish National, O'Neill was represented last season by **Spookydooky**, who had never finished outside the first five until pulling up in the race won by Vicente at Ayr last April.

O'Neill says: "He had a long season but he'd be another for a race like the Welsh National and other long-distance chases.

"The handicapper looks to have him in his grasp now though, so it will maybe be tougher for him."

'Very strong and powerful'

The Welsh National could also be on the agenda for arguably one of the most promising horses at Jackdaws, **Beg To Differ**, who was last seen unseating Aidan Coleman in the Ultima Handicap Chase but retains a great deal of potential at only six.

O'Neill is clearly fond of the son of Flemensfirth and says: "We're looking forward to him. He was pretty raw in his jumping as a novice last year at times but he's come back in very good order, he looks very strong and powerful."

Upswing contested last season's Welsh National and was pulled up, but

could it be Aintree this time around for the eight-year-old?

His trainer is now of the opinion he could be a spring horse and will therefore not be rushing him for any early season targets.

"He's a nice horse but I don't really know what he'll go for at this point," says the trainer. "He improved as the season went on last year and I'm starting to think he maybe isn't an early season horse. He seems to come to life more as you go along, so we wouldn't be in a hurry with him."

Champagne could sparkle

Of those about to embark on their chasing careers, the pick would appear to be **Champagne At Tara**, who gave a hint at his ability when second in a Grade 3 handicap hurdle over 2m4f in April, leaving him rated 135 over the smaller obstacles.

"He's had a few problems along the way but he seems like he might have grown up now and got over them, so hopefully he can show his true ability," says O'Neill. "If he does jump, you'd certainly be looking forward to him."

A return to the larger obstacles also beckons for **Join The Clan**, whose only experience of chasing saw him bump into an extremely talented sort in Bristol De Mai at Leicester last December.

Three times a winner over hurdles, the seven-year-old continues to please in his schooling at home and O'Neill remains



optimistic about his chasing prospects, saying: "He's not the biggest but he's very honest and a grand horse to have. We've schooled him over fences and he jumps away grand at home."

If there are question marks over Join The Clan, mystery surrounds **Forthefunofit**, who has run only eight times during his seven years but has managed to achieve a mark of 132 over hurdles in that time.

Connections are keeping the faith despite the string of soundness issues that have plagued his career and he could well be a horse to keep an eye on.

"He has ability but he's hard to train," says O'Neill. "He's back in training now and looks great – he's another I'd expect to go chasing. He's got potential but the problem is keeping him together."

Another for the notebook is the Paul and Clare Rooney-owned **Go Conquer**, also a lightly raced seven-year-old but one who has been with O'Neill only since last November.

His three runs in that time concluded with a win at Wincanton and O'Neill is cautiously optimistic that he may have found the key to the son of Arcadio.

O'Neill explained: "We got a bit lost with him when he first came – it took us a while to get to know him but I'm hopeful there's more improvement in him this year. He could be a nice horse."

The dual-purpose performer **Matorico** is another who could be set to see a fence in the near future, while **Capard King** will be competitively campaigned, albeit despite O'Neill's concern that he may be in the grip of the handicapper.

THE LOWDOWN DAVID PIPE

Festival aces Temps and Racer lead a promising team from Pond House

KEY measure of how the season has gone for the bigger yards is how they did at Cheltenham, and for David Pipe, with so much festival history behind his Pond House operation, success over those four days in March is all the more important.

The pressure was soon off for Pipe last season, for having sat out the first two races of Tuesday's card he scored with **Un Temps Pour Tout** in race three, the Ultima Handicap Chase. Un Temps Pour Tout did not just win either – he bolted up from well-handicapped Holywell in what looked a two-horse race from a fair way out.

There was no second winner, but others from the stable ran well and Pipe's tenth season – yes tenth, although it does not seem that long – ended with a very respectable 80 winners and well over £1 million in prize-money in Britain, those figures not including Un Temps Pour Tout's highly prestigious win in the previous June's Grande Course de Haies d'Auteuil, which is to all intents and purposes the French Champion Hurdle and is worth £129,000 to the winner.

Pipe has high hopes of Un Temps Pour Tout

once again and says: "People think it's a bad season if you don't have a Cheltenham winner. It's not, but the meeting is our shop window and I was very glad to get a winner in so early.

"Un Temps Pour Tout will be going for the better 3m-plus chases, handicaps and conditions races, and he'll probably have an entry in the Hennessy, which I think will suit him well.

"He's a very good horse, and on his day he's very hard to get past. The first half of the season didn't go to plan, but it all came right at the festival, albeit in the Ultima rather than the RSA Chase, which was where we thought we would end up."

Moon Racer, who won the Weatherby's Champion Bumper at the 2015 festival, is another big name to look out for after a frustrating second season in which he raced only once.

Pipe says: "He did very well to be second in the Punchestown bumper considering he'd been off so long and the race didn't really pan out for him. We'd hoped to get him ready for the Supreme Novices', but we ran out of time. He's well forward this time. Hopefully he can go to the top of the division in 2m novice hurdles."

Pipe is delighted that **Red Sherlock**, another who has been on the sidelines, is back, saying: "We tried to get him back last season,

and we did get close. Fingers crossed we'll manage it now, as he's obviously very talented and has been beaten just the once in seven starts, when he got a tendon injury against Faugheen in the Neptune two years ago."

Doctor Harper, another for the Johnson family, was strongly fancied for the Kim Muir at Cheltenham in March, but the writing was on the wall at an early stage. Pipe says: "He made a mistake at the first and could never really get into a rhythm after that. He disappointed at Haydock afterwards, but the ground was quick.

"He has to bounce back, but he's had a good break and hopefully he will. Unusually for a Presenting, his best form seems to be on soft ground."

Veterans back for more

Still also very much part of the set-up are **Ballynagour**, who has Graded wins to his name in the 2014 Byrne Group Plate over fences and in the 2015 Prix la Barka over hurdles, and **Dynaste**, who has struggled to get his head in front since the 2014 Ryanair Chase. They are both ten now, but both are back for more and Dynaste, in particular, is not acting his age.

Pipe says: "Dynaste is full of beans and has loads of enthusiasm still. He's got to go in Graded races or the better handicaps, and although he's still very good he's slightly on the downgrade. His mark is down to 153 now though, and if it drops to 150 he qualifies for veteran chases.

Ballynagour is rated slightly higher, having been second in good summer handicap chases off 152 and 157. Pipe adds: "Everyone knows Ballynagour isn't the easiest to predict, and we've probably seen the best of him, but he's a strong traveller and on his day he's still pretty good. He fell in the National, but may well have another try."

Aintree the target again

Vieux Lion Rouge is another Aintree possible, and the trainer says: "He had a good season and won at Haydock before running a great race at Cheltenham in the National

Hunt Chase. He then ran well when finishing seventh in the National, and that will be a target again. He could well go for the Becher Chase first."

Broadway Buffalo is another longdistance chaser to look forward to when he returns, hopefully in the second half of the season from the leg injury he picked up on his last appearance. There is more to come from him and he too could be Aintree bound.

Fellow handicap chaser **Katkeau**, an outand-out stayer who loves the mud, is high in the ratings but will qualify for veteran chases in the second half of the season.

Gevrey Chambertin, who is "talented but quirky" and has not scaled the heights once hoped for him, is still at Pond House. He



did well last season, winning twice, and is likely to have another go over fences. When tried before he has never jumped as well in public as he had done at home, where he is "brilliant".

Dell' Arca is another who is not easy to predict, but the handicapper has given him a chance and Pipe hopes he might pop up again one day in a decent handicap, either over hurdles or fences.

Novice chase aspirations

DID YOU KNOW?

The pick of the novice chasers include two well known names, Champers On Ice and Starchitect.

Champers On Ice, who finished third to Unowhatimeanharry in the Albert Bartlett, is an obvious candidate for top honours. Pipe

When David Pipe took over from his father Martin he began his training career in the perfect style, with a double at Kelso in May 2006. By the end of the 2006-07 season, Pipe's tally of winners stood at 134, more than any other trainer. Since then Pipe has surpassed the 1,000-winner mark. David is named after his grandfather, who began the legend of Pond House in 1973 when he sold his bookmaking chain to William Hill and bought a derelict pig farm, from where his son

Martin would begin his record-breaking training career.

reports the six-year-old has had a good break and summered well, and he adds: "He's got that relentless gallop and we're hoping he can take high rank, with the RSA Chase an obvious target.

"He wore cheekpieces at Cheltenham, but I don't think he'll be starting off over fences in them. They were just to help him go Cheltenham pace on that better ground."

Betfair Hurdle runner-up Starchitect, a Flat winner during the summer, is another who is likely to go novice chasing. Pipe says: "He competed in all the best handicaps and ran with great credit, finally getting his head in front at Newton Abbot on his last run over hurdles.

"He'd have run at Royal Ascot if he'd made the cut. He's staying better now, and anything



over 2m4f looks like his distance.

A novice hurdler to make a note of is **Mr Big Shot**, who surprised the team when he made a winning debut in a bumper at Uttoxeter. "The penny didn't drop until the last two furlongs, but he won well," says the trainer. "It was a decent bumper and he's a massive horse who looks a nice prospect."

Promising new recruits

As usual at this time of the year there are new recruits to watch out for. Among them is **Magie Du Ma**, who could prove a top juvenile.

"She's one to look forward to," says Pipe.
"She has good form in France, where she's already a winner and has run well against

some of their best three-year-olds. I think she'll be rated around 140, but is eligible for iuvenile hurdles."

Pipe bought **King's Socks** at the same sale and says: "He's a four-year-old who has some very good form in France over fences and hurdles. He's a handicapper under both codes, rated around the 150 mark so will hopefully be competing at a decent level."

Shaama Grise, a handicap hurdler and novice chaser, with recent form at Auteuil, and **Dauphine Ereine**, a four-year-old half-sister to Dynaste who has already won three chases, also came from France, as did **Full**, who has been placed over hurdles at Auteuil and has novice handicaps as an option.

Several others have been bought from the point-to-point field. The first Pipe mentions is **It's Obvious**, an Irish pointer bought at Aintree, described as "a big horse who hopefully has a nice future".

Ramses De Teillee, "a racy type who won his second point-to-point and could start in a bumper", and Orchard Thieves, a tall angular gelding who was second in an Irish point-to-point, are also dark horses who could be anything.

Even though numbers might be down a shade on last season, there is clearly plenty to look forward to from the Pond House team.

THE LOWDOWN DAN SKELTON

Progress looks nailed on as quest for success at top table continues

FTER nine years as assistant to Paul Nicholls, Dan Skelton left Ditcheat not only with an appetite for success and also an appetite to dine at the same top table as the ten times champion jumps trainer.

Having trained superstar jumpers like Kauto Star, Big Buck's and Master Minded, Nicholls set the bar very high but, after just three seasons with a licence, his student is on the right path establishing his state of the art Lodge Hill in Shelfield Green, Warwickshire among the best in Britain.

Last term Skelton recorded his first century, ending what was only his third campaign with a licence with 104 winners who collected total prize-money of $\pounds 1.2$ million on top of which came a first Cheltenham Festival winner when Superb Story landed the County Hurdle.

Skelton finished only 18 winners behind his mentor but more than £1m short in prizemoney, the only numbers that matter in trainers' championships.

Nevertheless, with brother Harry as stable jockey, Skelton believes there is scope for the yard's fortunes to improve yet again. There has been investment in new blood among a

string of around 120 horses but also in the infrastructure of the yard including the completion of a new accommodation block for stable staff.

"It's not a secret what our objective is," says Skelton. "There is a massive gap in prizemoney between me and Paul. I think we have the quality to step up again this year but after going from £700,000 to £1.2m the percentage gains are going to be smaller. That's not to say we won't still be looking for them.

"The main change is we've put in an accommodation block for the staff with 14 rooms and two flats. We know how important it is to have good staff. They now have a big block with a gym, living room, dining room, all en suite bedrooms which will hopefully pay dividends. We've also put in a new sand ring, a new jumping lane and installed more infrared lights in stables."

Superb Story's festival triumph was an exercise in patience by Skelton who kept him off the track after the Greatwood Hurdle in November to deliver a headline victory for the team in March. He will be given a similar preparation this season.

"It was great that he gave us our first Cheltenham Festival winner," says the trainer. "If I had my time again I wouldn't have gone to Galway afterwards but it was worth so much money, he likes decent ground and he hasn't been over-raced, but

everything that could go wrong on the day did and he pulled up.

"He's out in the field and will get all of September off and we'll look to resume and build up to March. I still think he's progressive and there's scope within his handicap mark so he'll stick to hurdling for a while yet."

More to come from Scottish ace

With no intention on the trainer's part, Skelton has been labelled a 2m hurdle specialist and the horse who delivered his richest win last season was Ch'Tibello, who took the Scottish Champion Hurdle either side of place finishes in the Gerry Feilden and Swinton Hurdles.

"I'm not deliberately leaning towards those races, it's where we ended up," he says. "Ch'Tibello won the Scottish Champion Hurdle but in the autumn had a frustrating time as he kept bumping into all the best novices. He delivered when we really wanted him to at Ayr. It was probably a run too many at Haydock.

"I think there's scope for him to do more

back in training but this could be his final

"We took the approach that if he's okay we'll creep on," says Skelton. "The idea is he'll come back to me during September and we'll work towards the Peterborough again. If he won that we might call it a day with him. He's such a good horse he doesn't owe anyone anything."

Promising young brigade

Success this season will depend on the younger brigade being able to step up, and Skelton is not short of candidates including Virgilio, Its'afreebee, Welsh Shadow and Mister Miyagi.

Virgilio won his first three starts for Skelton until pulling up in the Relkeel Hurdle in January but got off the mark over fences in May. Its'afreebee won the Rossington Main and finished third in the Neptune Investment Management Novices' Hurdle with stablemate Welsh Shadow in fifth. Mister Miyagi suffered his only defeat over hurdles in the Supreme.

"Virgilio is a lovely horse," says Skelton. "He was really good at Warwick on his chasing debut. He was a disaster when I ran him on bad ground at Cheltenham over new year so I've got to keep him away from that. Hopefully he'll run at the October Cheltenham meeting then go on to the Rising Stars at Wincanton.

"Its'afreebee has been amazing. We boughthim last year. He's a bit unconventional looking but he's such a willing partner. He really tries hard. He won a Grade 2 having improved beyond all recognition. I think there's more to come. He always keeps pulling out a little bit. We'll go straight over fences, start him off in a beginners' chase and work him up from there.

"Welsh Shadow is very talented and from a great family. He improved from bumpers to win a Listed novice hurdle but he'll go chasing now after winning a decent match race at Ayr at the end of last season. He'll start over two miles and in time he'll be a 3m chaser.

"Mister Miyagi had a good season. I always thought he was going to be pretty smart and I'm glad he went the way he did as he could have got lost on the bad ground over the winter. The owners were keen to let me keep him away from it and he picked up really well at the end of the season over 2m4f. That opens up new avenues for him. He's not one of those horses we've got to the bottom of so he'll carry on over hurdles."

A real improver

Two Taffs was one of five winners for Skelton at Ayr last season and is earmarked for better things along with Kasakh Noir.

"He's a real improver. He's getting stronger all the time and the type to make a very good chaser. He's not ready for that mentally yet. I'll probably aim him at the Persian War at Chepstow and then look to go to the Fixed Brush Hurdle at Haydock. He might improve for another season over hurdles.

"Kasakh Noir probably got made to look exceptional on his first start at Newbury



where they went very fast, not many got home and he came from the back and won as he liked. He's a decent horse and a chaser for the future but not one ready to go and do it just yet. We'll probably look at the Elite or Gerry Feilden Hurdle before making plans."

Harvey has more to give

North Hill Harvey has registered just one victory but was seen in the best company running second to Barters Hill last season and finishing fourth to Buveur D'Air at Aintree.

track is a strong-staying two-miler," says Skelton.

"I tried him over two and a half against Barters Hill and he ran creditably but was never going to beat him.

"He won at Cheltenham in December and I think barring a mistake two out in the Supreme he could have finished second. He wasn't at his absolute best at Aintree.

"I don't think we're done with him yet over hurdles but will be schooling him over fences before we make a decision. How high he can go I don't know."

Value At Risk began a novice chase "He works like a stayer at home but on the campaign but by March was winning a Grade 2 hurdle at Fairyhouse.

> "He got it together in the end last season but who was to blame is debatable," Skelton says. "I probably shouldn't have sent him straight into a Grade 2 at Newbury but if you'd seen him at home you'd have no problem running him anywhere.

"It took a couple of runs over hurdles before we got the wheels back on but it all came together well at Fairyhouse. We'll start over fences early autumn and give it our best shot. He's obviously very good. He just needs all the chips to fall right for him."

Dan and brother Harry are the sons of Olympic gold medallist Nick Skelton, and it's fair to say Harry has much more of his father's riding genes, although Dan did used to be an amateur rider and rode a winner. Skelton has already made a super start to his training career, amassing 27 winners in his first full season training and over 100 last term.

Meet The Legend has demonstrated in three starts for Skelton he could be a candidate for the big handicap hurdles.

"He came to us midway through last season and won a decent novices hurdle at Newbury. It means he's not a novice this season, but a fast-run race will suit him and I might take him straight to the Greatwood Hurdle. I think there's improvement in him."

Patience can start to pay off

Of his second-season chasers Skelton expects to get more out of Three Musketeers, who won a Grade 2 novice chase from Activial before finishing fourth in the JLT. And there is more to come from Pain Au Chocolat and Long House Haul, who has won the Summer Plate at Market Rasen.

"I've always trained **Three Musketeers** knowing there's the potential for massive improvement," the trainer says.

"We've protected him so he needs to repay

our patience with him and I think he's well able to do that now now.

"Pain Au Chocolat is such an honest horse who would probably win a moderate novice chase as well as he would a good one. He's always full bore and is a bit like that in training. In work we're trying to protect him from himself.

"He's eligible for graduation chases and that's the way he'll go. He's talented. He fell in the Future Champions Novices' Chase at Ayr when I felt 2m4f would help and he was over the top when he went to France. A graduation chase over the same trip round Kempton could be ideal for him.

Old Roan aim

"Long House Hall might get an entry in the Old Roan Chase at Aintree or he could go to Down Royal for a Grade 2. I wouldn't want to run him on bad ground through the winter. If we wanted to go back over hurdles we could

try the Coral Cup again but really we are sticking to chasing now."

There are lesser-known stable members and those new to the yard this season who should also go in the notebook, according to Skelton.

"Captain Forez is a novice hurdler for this year who will take time," he said. "He's a big horse who will make a chaser.

"Betameche won two bumpers and is a novice hurdler who could be one to follow.

"The same goes for **Asum**, who was third in his first bumper but met all sorts of trouble in running. **Mont Lachaux**, who we won the first three-year-old hurdle in Enghien with in March is a brother to Whisper and could go back to France for Graded races."

THE LOWDOWN COLIN TIZZARD

'Last year was our best - we're excited by what we can achieve now'

HEN Colin Tizzard started training a handful of point-to-pointers from Venn Farm in 1995 he surely couldn't have imagined the extent to which his fledgling operation would flourish over the next two decades.

The Dorset-based handler, whose twin passions are dairy farming and horses, goes into the new jumps season on the back of a record-breaking 2015-16 campaign blessed with one of the strongest equine teams in Britain, and it is by no means inconceivable he could be triply represented in the sport's most prestigious race, the Cheltenham Gold Cup, with Thistlecrack, Cue Card and Native River.

Last term's win and place prize-money total of £1,442,082 - boosted considerably by the Grade 1 exploits of World Hurdle hero Thistlecrack, arguably the most exciting jumps horse in training at present, and Cue Card's trio of triumphs at the highest level saw Team Tizzard gatecrash the top four in the first time.

Only the mighty battalions of multiple champion Paul Nicholls, Irish maestro Willie Mullins and Lambourn legend Nicky Henderson finished above the Sherborne stable.

West Country big guns Philip Hobbs and David Pipe, plus the likes of Alan King and Jonjo O'Neill were below Tizzard.

Tizzard's son and assistant Joe is fiercely proud of the achievement, but prefers to look to the future rather than dwell in the past.

"It was another big step forward for the stable," he says. "It was our best year by a long way, and we're all very excited about what we can achieve over the next few seasons.

"We've got the most beautiful bunch of horses. The babies we've looked after for a couple of seasons are coming through now to join the more established names.

"We have a team of around 70 horses, and there are some very promising individuals among them. We can't wait for the season proper to start."

A record number of over 2,000 people visited Venn Farm for the stable's annual open day on August Bank Holiday Monday, confirmation the Tizzards are now established among the elite trainers.

"It was an incredible turnout," Tizzard the British jump trainers' championship for recalls. "We were overwhelmed by the number of people here. Many, of course, came to see Thistlecrack and Cue Card. They are public horses after all they have achieved,

and people love to see them."

Thistlecrack's progress last season was nothing short of sensational, the eight-year-old winning all five of his starts, including the World Hurdle, in seemingly effortless fashion. His cruising speed had to be seen to be believed, and somehow he managed to go through an entire season without coming off the bridle.

His official rating soared from 150 to 174 during the course of the campaign, and he will now pursue a novice chasing path which connections hope will lead to the Gold Cup.

"Thistlecrack is set to go down the novice chasing route, perhaps beginning at Chepstow over 2m4f in early October and, if all goes well, he could run in the Gold Cup next spring along with Cue Card and Native River," Tizzard explains.

"We'll take it step by step with him, but there's no reason why he can't end up in the Gold Cup in his first season over fences.

"He's the most exciting horse we've ever had at Venn Farm and possesses so much class. It's quite frightening really when you consider we haven't got to the bottom of him. "His owners, the Snooks, are very keen on him going chasing this season, and the Gold Cup is the natural target for a horse of his calibre and potential.

"If things didn't pan out as we would hope, Thistlecrack can always go back over hurdles and defend his World Hurdle crown. There are plenty of options for him."

Card to take familiar path

The wonderfully talented ten-year-old **Cue Card**, denied a £1m triple crown bonus when taking a costly fall at the third-last in last season's Gold Cup won by Don Cossack, is expected to prove as good as ever this time.

"He's some horse, and has come back in looking an absolute picture," Tizzard reveals. "We'll go the same route with him as last year, taking in the Charlie Hall Chase, Betfair Chase, King George, Gold Cup and Betfred Bowl at Aintree.

"He was in the form of his life last season, winning four of those races after benefiting from an operation on a trapped epiglottis.

"He had an amazing season, and it was just a shame what happened in the Gold Cup. We'll never know if he'd have won had he stood up. It was the first time he had fallen, but that's championship racing for you."



of his illustrious career, but Tizzard cannot see any sign of age taking its toll.

"He's showing no sign of age whatsoever," he says. "The horse certainly looks as good as ever and we're very excited about the new season with him."

'He's looking a million dollars'

Hopes are high that the less-exposed sixyear-old **Native River** could also make sufficient progress to take his place in the Gold Cup.

Currently rated 154 following an impressive, strong-staying success in a Grade 1 novice chase over 3m1f at Aintree in April, the son of Indian River is being carefully laid out for the Hennessy

Gold Cup in late November.

"He's come back in looking a million dollars and really could be anything at this stage," Tizzard says. "He's grown again over the summer, and is a big, strong horse now. We're aiming him at the Hennessy, and I'm not sure as yet whether we'll give him a run beforehand. After all, I'd hate to see him touched off at Newbury under a penalty.

"The Gold Cup would be entirely possible

Aintree, a track that doesn't necessarily put a premium on stamina. He's a very exciting, progressive horse to have in the yard, and we're more than hopeful the best is yet to come."

Wind op for Theatre Guide

The Grand National is likely to be on the radar for several Tizzard chasers, including Masters Hill, Theatre Guide, Theatrical Star and Third Intention.

Perhaps it is Theatre Guide of that quartet who appears the most interesting with the 4m2½f Aintree marathon in mind.

Runner-up to Smad Place in the Hennessy last year, Theatre Guide progressed to land Kempton's BetBright Chase by ten lengths from Opening Batsman, and looks the type who could take to the demands of Aintree's National course.

"He's just had a wind op, and we feel it could make a big difference to him," Tizzard reveals. "The plan is to start him off in the 2m4f Listed chase he finished third in at Wetherby last October before having another crack at the Hennessy. Later on I could see him taking his chance in the Grand National."

Every progressive stable needs young, unexposed, exciting fresh talent to make the breakthrough each year, and there seems to be plenty of that type of horse lurking in the Venn Farm shadows.

West Approach, a half-brother to Thistlecrack, is one. "We purposely saved his novice status for this season," Tizzard says.

"He's going the right way, and will be aimed at a couple of the big novice races. He could even progress up to World Hurdle class in due course. He goes well at home, and we think an awful lot of him."

Cheltenham class

Quiz Master, an unraced four-year-old gelding, is another. "He got a bruised foot and missed all of last season which was a shame as we've always considered him a Cheltenham horse," Tizzard says.

"He'll start off in a bumper and, if he progresses in the way we hope he will, the Champion Bumper at the festival will be his target. He's a gorgeous horse owned by Brocade Racing, and is one to keep an eye out for."



Elegant Escape, a four-year-old Dubai Destination gelding, is another for the notebook. "We paid decent money for him at Goffs in April after he finished second in a maiden point-to-point," Tizzard says.

"We turned him away over the summer, and are very pleased with him. He's a big horse who will start over hurdles, and looks to have a bright future. He's one of the more unexposed horses in the yard, but hopefully you'll be hearing plenty more about him in the coming years."

Another potential star Murrayana, Robinsfirth and Kings Walk are others who receive favourable mentions, but it's clear from Tizzard's voice that the apple of his eye is Royal Vacation, a six-year-old King's Theatre gelding who has the potential to take high rank over fences this campaign.

"He goes novice chasing this season and we think he has the potential to be a star over fences," Tizzard enthuses. "We're very excited about his future. He won three times last term and we're going to tweak his wind ahead of aiming him at the top events between 2m4f to 3m. He's a lovely horse. We've been patient with him, and he's definitely one to follow. I really like him."

Team Tizzard have come a long way in 21 years, but the journey is far from over. Further heroics from Thistlecrack and Cue Card this season plus the emergence into Graded company of some of the younger, highly regarded brigade could well push them up another rung towards the top of the ladder.

VIEW FROM IRELAND RICHARD FORRISTAL

It's going to be a hard act to follow after last season's heroics

S a rule, the conclusion that there isn't much room for improvement in something or other would infer negative connotations.

That is possibly no less true in relation to the collective exploits of Irish jump racing's leading performers, but it is also indicative of the dizzy heights that were scaled throughout the 2015-2016 season.

Below the surface the industry continues to contract alarmingly, but those in the elite echelon have combined to set the bar ridiculously high.

The retrospective promotion of **Josies Orders** in the cross-country race meant Irish-trained runners outscored the locals at the 2016 Cheltenham Festival for the first time in history. In March, the addition of the mares' novices' hurdle saw 28 races run across the four-day Cotswolds bonanza. By the close of play the raiders had equalled the previous best of 14 to share the honours, and subsequent events saw them set that new benchmark.

It was a hollow victory announced to little fanfare, but it is a reflection of the unprecedented prowess with which the heavyweight Irish prize fighters are being campaigned over jumps right now.

Don Cossack secured Gordon Elliott a

famous Gold Cup success at Prestbury Park, three days after **Annie Power** carved her own little piece of history by emulating Dawn Run with a devastating Champion Hurdle triumph. By setting a record time, her performance left many to muse that she only got to compete in the 2m decider as a result of the respective defections of reigning title-holder Faugheen and Arctic Fire.

However, apart from being a consequence of the bloated big-race programme, that is a symptom of Willie Mullins' continued omnipotence. The incredible champion trainer again departed Cheltenham with a mind-boggling seven winners, and he went on to push Paul Nicholls all the way to the wire in the British trainers' championship.

Mullins exerts a startling level of dominance and, while he is unlikely to play it up, there must be a chance he will have another go at wresting away Nicholls' crown.

Getting chinned at Sandown will have left a mark that the competitive instinct in him will surely want to repair.

Mouse Morris also masterminded Grand National glory with **Rule The World**, having secured the Irish version with **Rogue Angel** 11 days earlier. When you factor in the emergence of Joseph O'Brien, it is clear that Irish trainers will continue to flex their muscles at the highest level for a time to come.

SENIOR CHASERS

For the second year in a row, Don Cossack was crowned king of the staying chasing ranks by the official handicappers. This time, though, that distinction was complemented by a glorious Gold Cup victory, when he capitalised on Cue Card's dramatic exit to lead home a stunning one-two-three-four for the raiders.

Djakadam filled the runner-up berth again and may well be campaigned over slightly shorter trips this term, although there aren't many better than him in the staying ranks. **Don Poli**, on the other hand, confirmed his status as a quality slogger with a laboured third at Cheltenham. He and the fourth **Carlingford Lough** could well win more Grade 1s, but you would expect them to again come up short in the Prestbury Park showpiece.

Gordon Elliott, who lost the exciting No More Heroes at Cheltenham, remains optimistic he will get Don Cossack back following his tendon strain in time for a prep run ahead of the Gold Cup, with the Kinloch Brae at Thurles already pencilled in. Horses like Road To Riches, Un De Sceaux, Killultagh Vic and Black Hercules are classy, trip-versatile individuals who will all add depth to the chasing ranks.

Douvan and **Vautour** are the two who will likely cause Willie Mullins and pundits the greatest reason for procrastination. Vautour seemed to confirm he isn't a two-miler at Punchestown, and many would relish the prospect of seeing the runaway Ryanair winner and narrow King George runner-up tackle the Gold Cup. The mighty Douvan will surely lead the two-mile charge. He was a sensational novice who will prove a formidable prospect if he matures, but could Mullins be tempted to see if he is the horse to break his Gold Cup hoodoo? Don't discount that possibility.



SENIOR HURDLERS

Annie Power reigned supreme in Faugheen's absence last March. She is by some way the best mare we have seen since Dawn Run, and, should she and Faugheen perform to their respective optimum levels, Mullins is going to have some big calls to make. Good luck to anyone second-guessing how it will play out.

Faugheen produced a career-best turn in the Irish Champion Hurdle before succumbing to injury. Should Mullins and Rich Ricci ever decide to pit them against each other, it would constitute a showdown on a par with those epic Kauto Star-Denman duels. Fascinatingly, elsewhere in these pages, Mullins has mooted the possibility of Yorkhill going down the Champion Hurdle



Jer's Girl and the returning Jezki are others who have the scope to make a big impact. There is real depth across the entire spectrum of Irish hurdlers.

Over fences, it is hard not to get excited about the prospect of seeing Yorkhill strut his stuff: he has all the attributes of a horse who could go right to the top. His talented but unfurnished stablemate Min might be better suited to chasing, while Identity Thief is another who could be interesting over the bigger obstacles for Henry de Bromhead.

We are even more precariously in the realm of conjecture with the hurdlers. Mullins will go to war with the likes of **Blow** By Blow, Bacardys, Battleford, Avenir D'Une Vie and Augusta Kate, while

will have a big bearing on this race as Faugheen and Annie Power are unlikely to run together, and out of the two it might be Faugheen who is asked to stretch out again and tackle longer distances.

After all, he is a former winner of the Neptune at Cheltenham, and has a Graded win to his name over three miles too.

Could there be a third Mullins contender to trump both of them, though? Quite possibly. Apple's Jade is owned by Gigginstown so could easily be given licence to attack either of the Rich Ricci-owned duo who go for the Champion.

Her second in the Triumph Hurdle might have hinted that she had limitations, but it

CHAMPION HURDLE

If someone had told you this time last year that Willie Mullins would win the 2016 Champion Hurdle no-one would have been surprised. The name of the horse might have been surprising though as it wasn't Faugheen who won, but the reinvented former World Hurdle second and mares' hurdle winner Annie Power.

She turned into the ultimate supersub, winning at Cheltenham easily, and is deservedly right up in the market for a repeat this season, perched alongside Faugheen with many layers at around 5-2.

CHAMPION CHASE

His transition to chasing was faultless - six wins from six starts including five Grade 1s and the closest any horse got to him was when Sizing John ran him to seven lengths at Cheltenham.

He is already odds-on in some places and, while there is always plenty of conjecture about where and how a Mullins horse may be campaigned during the season, it would be a surprise if Douvan was asked to go up in trip.

Mullins has never won the Champion

Chase and he would surely never have a better chance of doing so.

Sprinter Sacre's renaissance last season was a fantastic story and it was great to see. A fall for Un De Sceaux on his comeback and a couple of good wins for Sprinter in the first half of the campaign had people believing again, and he produced in glorious style at the festival, having the race won by the last fence.

It won't get any easier for him next year as an 11-year-old and facing a horse of Douvan's calibre, but his work is done. His legacy is secure and, while it is hard to see him locking horns with the younger Douvan and coming off best, he could still be placed at Cheltenham.

There is scarce little else to get excited about in this market. Vautour has always threatened to be effective over 2m as a chaser, but fluffed his lines at Punchestown during the spring meaning the experiment is only likely to be rekindled if something untoward happens to Douvan.

Traffic Fluide could get involved and did run well in the Clarence House on his only start of the previous campaign when third to Un De Sceaux. He would need to improve on that but he is only six and has run only ten times in his life so it is perfectly possible. Although, should Douvan prove to be unstoppable in the first half of the season, you may well see trainers with fringe candidates in this sphere looking elsewhere.

WORLD HURDLE

There is some good value to be had in this market with the first four in the betting not all likely to turn up.

Faugheen could come for this but easily might not. Thistlecrack goes chasing, Annie Power always gets quoted for this but doesn't stay and won the Champion Hurdle last season, while Vroum Vroum Mag might go the mares route again, or go chasing.

Therefore, **Jezki** at 16-1 looks fantastic value if he is fully recovered from the injury that kept him off the track last season. This is

a horse who has won eight Grade 1s including the Champion Hurdle, and on his latest start defeated Hurricane Fly at Punchestown over three miles, thereby proving conclusively he stays the World Hurdle trip.

His season-ending injury, picked up last autumn, was a surprise as he had previously stood up to some rigorous campaigns without a blemish. However, it was caught early, he has had ample time to recover, and it could have been for the best as Thistlecrack was unbeatable in this division in his absence.

Jezki will be nine by the time of the next festival, but that is not old in staying terms and he could easily have a big say in the destination of the World Hurdle.

The other interesting one here is Shaneshill, who has festival form figures of 222. He ran a cracker in the RSA Chase last season when second to Blaklion and then reverted to hurdles where he might have won a Grade 1 at Punchestown (the same race Jezki won in 2015) but for falling at the last. He was last seen in America in the Iroquois

Hurdle, finishing second to Rawnaq, so don't be surprised if he isn't out too early this time as he had a hard spring.

CHELTENHAM GOLD CUP

The Gold Cup is baffling hence why it is 7-1 the field. How will Thistlecrack get on chasing? Will Don Cossack return? Will Vautour stay and will he even go for it? Can Cue Card possibly be as good as he was? Will Coneygree be as good as he was?

With all these unknowns it may be best to stick to the tried and trusted **Djakadam**. He has finished second in the previous two renewals and has achieved a lot for a young horse. He will only be eight next season yet has already won a Thyestes, a John Durkan and been placed numerous times at the top level.

As a lightly raced sort, there may well be some improvement left in him and he obviously acts well round Cheltenham so the 16-1 currently available looks tempting.

Of those at the top end of the market,



Thistlecrack could easily be the most dangerous. Yes he will be a novice and he will be nine next year, but such was the class he showed over hurdles last season (rated 174) that if he took to the job he might blitz all of these. Things are rarely that easy in racing, but Colin Tizzard has good reason to hope he can do what Cue Card failed to do last season and win the Gold Cup.

KING GEORGE

Cue Card did win the King George, just touching off Vautour, and that pair are sure to be back at Kempton again on Boxing Day.

Of the two, Vautour might come off best this time as he was only a slow jump away from winning last year. However, he is already favourite, and if you wanted a speculative bet then Tea For Two fits the

GRAND NATIONAL

Alvarado: has National

The 2016 Grand National was remarkable for a few reasons. It was won by a novice in Rule The World and it was almost won by a 13-year-old in Vics Canvas. The latter wasn't the first to excel over the National fences as an oldie as Hello Bud and Oscar Time have both won races there as teenagers.

Therefore, Alvarado, a young buck at the age of 12 should be given due consideration. He has finished fourth in the race twice and was a great second in the Scottish National on his last start behind Vicente. Hopefully that will put him high enough in the handicap to get a run – something he missed out on last season. He still has more to offer.

Bristol De Mai (Nigel Twiston-Davies) A Grade 1-winning juvenile hurdler, he repeated the feat over fences as a novice last season. He should develop into a 165+ chaser this season and a current official mark of 154 gives him the option of tackling some of the better handicaps.

Ch'Tibello (Dan Skelton) His current official mark of 144 is a fair reflection of his form, but he can rate a fair bit higher and Cheltenham's Greatwood Hurdle looks a logical early season

Henri Parry Morgan (Peter Bowen) Unseated his rider when favourite for the bet365 Gold Cup at Sandown, but he has a mark of 150 and looks an ideal type for the big staying handicap chases.

Vintage Vinnie (Rebecca Curtis) Scored over hurdles in September and an official chase mark of 129 looks ripe for exploitation now stable is back in better form.

ON THE CLOCK



Altior (Nicky Henderson) Unbeaten in five starts over hurdles, he clocked a time that stacked up well against the Champion Hurdle when slamming a smart field in the Supreme Novices' and can take high rank among this season's novice chasers.

Coneygree (Mark Bradstock) Sidelined with a hock injury for most of last season, he left an indelible impression when lifting the 2015 Gold Cup and can confirm he is still the best staying chaser around.

Definitly Red (Brian Ellison) Runner-up to subsequent festival winners at Warwick and Wetherby, the four-miler at Cheltenham proved too much, but he could still be well

Taper Tantrum (Michael Bell) An 80-rated handicapper on the Flat, he made a fine start to the hurdling by winning at Newton Abbot and earned a decent figure when following up at Stratford. He can make his mark in much better grade.

Yanworth (Alan King) Looked the real deal when routing his rivals on Cheltenham Trials day in January but could not match strides with Yorkhill in a moderately paced Neptune. Keep the faith.

HORSES AND JOCKEYS TO FOLLOW RICHARD BIRCH

I'm sticking with mighty Don – but backing him at 25s for National glory

IX months have passed since that hugely expensive day, but I still can't get Don Poli out of my mind as the 2016-17 jumps season proper dawns.

I spent nearly all of last season utterly convinced that the stamina-packed 2015 RSA Chase hero was tailor-made for the demands of the Gold Cup and backed him accordingly.

Don Poli performed well to finish third in chasing's blue riband after being settled well off the pace, but the overwhelming feeling when he crossed the line was one of disappointment.

A subsequent Aintree second to Cue Card, where he was given a far more attacking ride, tends to confirm popular belief the seven-year-old is just below the very best chasers in the land, but I am still adamant he possesses the raw ability to bulldoze his way up the Cheltenham hill to win a Gold Cup if the ground comes up soft or heavy.

That rarely happens, though, so it is time to focus on perhaps a more realistic Plan B, and invest plenty of cash on him winning the Grand National instead.

As I have said so many times before, Don Poli is all about stamina. He jumps well and is just the type to get into a good rhythm over those Aintree fences which are considerably less challenging than they used to be.

With so much potential Gold Cup ammunition to fire, it would come as no surprise if his trainer Willie Mullins earmarked the National as 161-rated Don Poli's principal target for this campaign, and the general 25-1 is simply too big to resist at this stage.

Another horse who I am particularly looking forward to seeing this winter is 107-rated hurdler **Arty Campbell**.

Bernard Llewellyn's stayer was in cracking form on the Flat during the summer, winning 2m handicaps at Chepstow and Kempton before finishing an excellent Goodwood third to Sir Mark Prescott's hugely progressive three-year-old St Michel.

It doesn't take a genius to work out that Arty Campbell, who boasts an official Flat rating of 84, is potentially thrown in over jumps, and last November's narrow Kempton second to Thunder Sheik stands the closest of inspection.

Best on good ground, there will doubtless be a plan for Arty Campbell which could revolve around a valuable handicap or two next spring, and he is emphatically one to follow, particularly when stepped up to 2m4f.

Baywing became a great personal favourite of mine last season, winning four heavy-ground handicap hurdles in the style

of a rapidly progressive stayer.

His trainer Nicky Richards places this type of horse particularly well, and Baywing's confidence was sky-high when he stepped up in grade to win a Class 3 event at Haydock in January.

I have no doubt it will pay to follow Baywing once again in his novice chase campaign, bearing in mind he needs testing conditions to excel.



It will be great to see the better horses out again in late autumn and early winter because the overall quality of summer jumping this year seemed poorer than in recent seasons. One reason could be the retirement of John Ferguson, who tended to send out a string of winners during May to September, and he will also be missed this winter.

TRAINERS

Most people expect Dan Skelton to take another significant step forward, including his mentor Paul Nicholls, and it would be no surprise to see him break into racing's top four, joining Nicholls, Mullins and Nicky Henderson.

Colin Tizzard's stable, blessed with two of jump racing's most popular performers, Thistlecrack and Cue Card, should enjoy another wonderful season, while Nigel Twiston-Davies also has the ammunition to do well once again.

JOCKEYS

The latter's son Sam flourished in his role as stable jockey to Nicholls in the second half of last season, and bagged three Cheltenham Festival winners plus a Scottish National via Vicente.

He took that confidence into the start of the new season, and even led Richard Johnson at one point.

Twiston-Davies and his friend Aidan Coleman both have the talent and drive to put Johnson under far more pressure than he experienced during last year's runaway title romp, while further progress from an even younger gun Sean Bowen is also anticipated.

Craig Nichol, unquestionably the most promising rider in the north, should do well once again, while David Noonan and Harry Cobden will both be looking to build on excellent campaigns which suggest they have very bright futures indeed.

The leaves are beginning to fall off the trees and the nights are getting longer. That can only mean the likes of Sprinter Sacre, Annie Power, Vautour, Vroum Vroum Mag, Faugheen and Don Poli, of course, will soon be back in action. I can't wait.

DARK HORSES DAVE ORTON

Fire can burn bright to give Mullins another player for the big days

BRAHMS DE CLERMONT Paul Nicholls

Towards the backend of last season champion trainer Nicholls unleashed a flurry of bumper winners. Among them was this French-bred five-year-old, who created an outstanding impression when serving up a demolition job on his debut at Taunton. He powered clear to score despite being green and looked well suited by the good ground. From the same family as the yard's brilliant Master Minded, his novice hurdle campaign should be fruitful.

BABENY BRIDGE Nick Williams

Once considered a smart prospect by the Williams family, Babeny Bridge has had his problems since recording a fifth point-to-point success in 2014. However, his return from a layoff, in a novice hurdle over 3m at Worcester in May, showed the engine remains and he is considered to be attractively treated. He stays very well, is versatile regards underfoot conditions, and is one to be with when switched to regulation fences.

COUP DE PINCEAU Paul Nicholls

He shot clear once the penny dropped on his debut at Ludlow in April. He is related to very useful hurdler/chaser Une Artiste and out of a dam who scored over fences at up to 3m6f. With that in mind it will be interesting to see

what distance he kicks off at once sent hurdling. No doubt connections will have the spring festivals firmly in mind for him.

FIRE IN SOUL Willie Mullins

Despite costing €200,000 and hailing from top connections, Fire In Soul was allowed to go off at odds of 9-2 on his hurdling bow at Clonmel last season. The five-year-old comfortably completed the task, looking better the further he went over the minimum distance on deep ground. He failed to fire upped to Grade 2 company next time at Fairyhouse, but bounced back in no uncertain terms when slamming an interesting field at Ballinrobe in May. The runner-up came out and won a Flat maiden next time, and Mullins has yet another exciting prospect in his care.

GIBBES BAY Paul Nicholls

A 90,000gns purchase at the Cheltenham sales, this grey son of Al Namix was sent for a prestigious bumper at Ayr's Scottish National meeting for his racecourse debut. He came home a workmanlike winner, from a reliable sort in second, but the market suggested he might need the experience and he is very much a work in progress. Jumping fences will be his game in due course, but he has got a lot of scope and ought to win his share of hurdle races beforehand.

HOKE COLBURN Harry Whittington

An eyecatcher on his debut in a Warwick bumper in March, Hoke Colburn was well backed on his next outing at Southwell and didn't disappoint. He pulled clear with a promising mare, proving himself versatile regards ground, and will go under the radar somewhat when kicking off his novice hurdle campaign. He is a half-brother to a 3m winner and looks nailed on to improve.

LE BREUIL Ben Pauling

Created a deep impression when taking a bumper on his debut at Warwick in May by ten lengths. There was some ease in the ground that day and there was plenty to like about the way he went about his business, scoring under a confident ride. His young trainer can't wait to get him going over hurdles, and he is bred to make his mark in that sphere, although Pauling hasn't ruled out taking in another bumper under a penalty first. He could well be Graded class in time.

LE VAGABOND Edward O'Grady

This talented ex-French performer is proving a versatile acquisition for his Irish trainer. An unlucky run on the Flat at Galway during the summer was followed by an emphatic display when showing his true colours in decent company over 1m6f at Killarney. A switch back to hurdles beckons this season and he is expected to prove very well treated off a mark around 120. He looks just the sort his wily handler can get to the big spring festivals for some valuable handicaps.

PERFORM Philip Hobbs

An imposing horse, Perform strongly appeals as one to rise through the ranks this season. He was too keen on his Uttoxeter debut in March 2015 and showed vast improvement when winning back from a break at Aintree last October over 2m4f. He missed out the rest of last season, but is reportedly ready to show his true colours again and is in the right hands. Chasing will be on his agenda at some

stage, but off a mark in the mid-130s there is surely more to come over hurdles first.

QUEEN DEIRDRE Willie Mullins

More and more each year Ireland's champion trainer uses the Galway festival to unleash new and exciting prospects. This time around he took the final event on the Saturday when the highly promising Queen Deirdre bolted up on her bumper debut. Mullins was worried about her immaturity, being a four-year-old against more experienced elders, but she could hardly have won more impressively. She is bred to be high class over hurdles, being a half-sister to Identity Thief, who landed the Fighting Fifth last term. It will be very interesting to see if she is sent jumping or kept for a high-profile bumper campaign.

TOLETHORPE Harry Whittington

Whittington has made a name for himself over the past few seasons and this young chestnut gelding is expected to provide the trainer with another exciting novice hurdler. He overcame inexperience in fine style when shooting clear to win his bumper debut at Huntingdon in March on soft ground, and was immediately put away for the autumn. His half-sister Balmusette won a Listed event over jumps and, boasting a neat turn of foot, Graded races beckon if he matures along the right lines.

WOOLSTONE ONE Harry Whittington

This four-year-old filly really impressed when winning her first two junior bumpers for Whittington last term. Her trainer couldn't resist the temptation of then sending her for a Listed bumper at Sandown for her final outing, having previously said he would like to put her away, and it backfired as she trailed home last of the 13-strong field. That was just too bad to be true, but she can achieve her potential over hurdles. She has plenty of speed, winter ground holds no fears, and it will be fascinating to chart her progress.



FESTIVAL FANCIES PAUL KEALY

A dozen names I can't wait to see as excitement is starting to build

T IS hard not to be bursting with excitement for the start of the jumps season proper, but has there ever been a stranger market for the Cheltenham Gold Cup?

Favourite Thistlecrack has yet to jump a fence in public, second favourite Vautour ducked the gig last year, third favourite Don Cossack is injured, fourth favourite Cue Card will be 11 in March and no winner has been older than ten since 1969, fifth favourite Douvan is evens for the Champion Chase and sixth favourite Coneygree has raced just five times in the last 44 months.

We can expect as many market upheavals in that race as any other this season and I've had my stab at a left-field contender in the list below.

This list is not necessarily a list of horses likely to be challenging for top honours this season, but simply one of horses I am looking forward to seeing step up.

There are a lot of obvious star contenders missed out, but you know all about those anyway.

ALTIOR Nicky Henderson

One of the big surprises at the end of last season was the decision by connections of the Supreme Novices' Hurdle winner to swerve a potential follow-up at Aintree and school him over fences. Altior had demonstrated some change of gear when winning over hurdles at Christmas and did so again when slamming Min at Cheltenham. Wherever he ends up going, he is one of the stars in Britain and should continue to do well.

AUGUSTA KATE Willie Mullins

The strength in depth possessed by Mullins can be seen by looking at the markets for the Cheltenham novice hurdles – and he even has eight of the top ten in the betting for the novice mares' event. Any of the French imports could be something special, but the one thing we know about Augusta Kate is that she is very tough. The winner of her first two bumpers, she went on to run with credit in the Champion Bumper at Cheltenham, finishing seventh, and was then second in the Aintree mares' bumper before going on to win the mares' event at Punchestown. She

wasn't far off the best in that sphere, and should develop into a really good hurdler, possibly over further than 2m.

BRISTOL DE MAI Nigel Twiston-Davies

There is every hope this front-running grey can go to the top. Connections originally thought he was a two-miler, but he was a heavy-ground winner of the Finale Junior Hurdle at Chepstow two seasons ago and winners of that tend to stay well, and Bristol De Mai strikes as one who is going to get 3m. We have to remember he is only a a five-yearold and that, according to Racing Post Ratings, he was the best chaser of his age group in Britain or Ireland last season by 10lb. Indeed, he was the first horse for five years to break a chase RPR of 160 (he ran 161 twice) in the spring of his five-year-old campaign. His Jewson second came on good ground, so he does handle the surface but, assuming he improves again (and he has run only 15 times, finishing in the first two on 11 of them) he will move further up the pecking order on very soft ground this season.

CAPITAINE Paul Nicholls

Very well regarded by Nicholls, Capitaine was nonetheless defeated on his debut at Taunton in December. However, it might have been a decent race because the winner was sent to Ireland to run in a Grade 2 on his hurdles debut (no show) and the third is now already rated 138 over hurdles. Capitaine certainly made no mistake next time when sauntering clear at Wincanton to win by 13 lengths and 18 lengths in what looked a strongly run contest. He can take high rank among the British novice hurdlers this season.

CH'TIBELLO Dan Skelton

Skelton's patience with this five-year-old paid off when he returned from a near fivemonth break to win the Scottish Champion



Hurdle, and he may well have followed up in the Swinton had they gone faster earlier. The problem for Skelton is that he is going to have to be patient again as Ch'Tibello apparently can't go a yard on soft ground. That might change as he matures, but the five-year-old who ran Altior to a length and a quarter at Ascot last November, still looks nicely enough treated on a mark of 144.

DJAKADAM Willie Mullins

There are much darker horses in the Mullins camp than this dual Gold Cup runner-up, but I'm not prepared to guess about those I've never seen and I still think this is one of the most likely Gold Cup winners this season. He already has the course form to win an average Gold Cup and, while on paper next year's race may be anything but, we are used to horses falling by the wayside. He was the only horse able to live with Don Cossack and Cue Card in last season's Gold Cup and, while he would probably have finished third if the latter had remained on his feet, it was still a top effort. Djakadam, still only seven, ought to be at his absolute peak this season.

IDENTITY THIEF Henry de Bromhead

De Bromhead could do with a change of luck after losing all the Potts horses, but this one is likely to take the yard to all the top meetings. He might not have quite made the grade over hurdles last season, having gone off at just 8-1 for the Champion Hurdle, but it is worth remembering that was only his second season and he began rated just 137. He ended the campaign 22lb higher, so was clearly very much going the right way and he is an exciting prospect for fences this season. There are plenty of horses ahead of him in the betting for the Arkle and JLT, but his hurdles form is as good if not better than any of them and he has just as much potential.

MINELLA ROCCO Jonjo O'Neill

With Don Cossack far from certain to bounce back from injury, Cue Card soon to be turning 11 and Vautour probably odds-on to go for a penalty kick again, there is plenty of potential for some Gold Cup contenders to emerge and a slightly left-field one could be Minella Rocco. O'Neill's six-year-old looked very exciting as a novice hurdler and was expected to make a big splash as a novice chaser last season. Things did not go according to plan in the first half of the campaign with some sloppy jumping halting his progress, but he finally got his act together when second in the Reynoldstown at Ascot and then won the four-miler at the Cheltenham Festival. As he continues to become more accomplished at his fences, the six-year-old will surely have a lot more to give.

TOMMY SILVER Paul Nicholls

Nicholls had his fair share of juvenile hurdlers just below the top bracket last season and, of those, Tommy Silver was probably the most backward. He still showed plenty, though, finishing seventh in the Triumph Hurdle and a close third on the final day of the season. A big horse with plenty of scope, his future may lie over fences, but it will be a surprise if a handicap mark of 139 over hurdles is not left well behind.

TRAFFIC FLUIDE Gary Moore

If there is a trainer who deserves some luck in the 2016-17 jumps season it is Gary Moore, who suffered plenty of disappointment in the run-up to Cheltenham last season with the injuries to Ar Mad and Traffic Fluide. It is to be hoped both horses find their way back to full health this season and either could develop into a Champion Chase contender. Douvan will be in their way, but there will be big prizes to be won when the Mullins wonderhorse is not around and Traffic Fluide could pick up plenty of prize-money if returning fit and well. Still only a six-year-old and with just six British runs behind him, he will have more to come.

WAIT FOR ME Philip Hobbs

This six-year-old was a slow learner last season and he remains a horse with a huge amount of potential. Third to Moon Racer in the Champion Bumper two seasons ago, he began the last campaign by getting thrashed by Buveur D'Air at Newbury, when pulling far too hard, and his keen-going tendencies have so far held him back. A first-time hood almost did the trick at Cheltenham, where he was fourth in the County Hurdle, looking as though he wanted to go further if anything, but he was back to his hard-pulling ways in the Swinton next time. If and when he grows up and consents to race more professionally, he will be one of the best handicapped hurdlers around.

YANWORTH Alan King

A second in the Neptune to Yorkhill is a fair bit of form to have on your CV, but I think there is a chance we didn't quite see the best

of Alan King's six-year-old when it mattered in March. King had his string in rude health throughout the winter and had 40 winners from 152 runners from December to February, but was just five from 94 in March and April. That Neptune second was no bad run, but Yanworth had earlier looked a potential superstar when taking apart his field in the trials meeting at Cheltenham in January and, having never been seriously tested over hurdles before then, is worth another chance to prove he is the real deal. King said he seemed to have got quicker last season despite seeing out the 2m5f trip really well, and it will be interesting to see what route is decided upon.





A Good Skin (Ire)
